**More Broilers Are In Demand**  
OTTAWA—National production of broilers has been increasing rapidly because for this season, according to Leonard Griest, manager of the Experimental Farms, Canada Department of Agriculture, Fredericton, N.B., include: the development of disease control and management techniques which permit the successful operation of large scale poultry raising; the use of modern equipment in the placing of a high quality, palatable and nutritious product in the food stores at competitive prices.

**LABOUR SAVING**  
The use of scale production permits the use of mechanical feeders and other labour saving devices. With modern buildings and equipment one man can care for 20,000 or more birds. Extra labour is required to catch and crate the finished broilers and to clean the units which such equipment makes available.

**Integration** usually involves of raising broilers under one form of contract. This, in turn, helps to assure a steady supply of broilers for the market. Contracts may provide for financing the grower, or without them the grower may not be able to operate on a scale large enough for economical production.

**AND EGGS**  
The strain currently in demand for efficient broiler production are usually low egg producers. But work at the Fredericton Farms, indicates that the females of some local strains which were being mainly for egg production may be used for crossing with outstanding broiler strains and a similar purpose.

CROZER OR CAPTIVE?

A great deal of interest on the part of farm people is focused on the question of credit. Credit is something that some people still regard as a serious hazard and quite respectable. Possibly the wrong word is being used to describe the problem. Actually what the farmer needs is a satisfactory source of capital to finance his operation.

Agriculture has only within the last twenty years and more particularly within the last ten years reached the position where it requires greatly increased quantities of operating capital. Fifty years ago before the advent of a profit system of farming the farmer produced his own food. His requirements were quite modest. Today with inflation on every hand more and more money is required to keep the farm operating and the provision of this capital has now become one of the major problems facing farmers.

**Tor-Dominion Bank Reports Higher Earnings**  
The Toronto Dominion Bank's gain reports best earnings, deposits and assets for the year ended October 31st last. The bank revealed in the 102nd Annual Report that the total assets of the bank increased by \$1,382,572,332. Total deposits increased by \$39,646,531. Personal savings rose by \$13,823,032 and other deposits \$25,823,500.

Profits for the year rose to \$8,181,000, an increase of \$1,867,877 over a year ago. This is equivalent to \$2.04 per share. Rest account to 12.5 percent of total liabilities at \$4,671,906 a year ago. Another year of savings and a greater interest is reflected in the balance sheet.

**A. V. Roe Appoints Three Executive Vice-Presidents**  
TORONTO (CP)—Appointment of three executive vice-presidents was announced Wednesday by Crawford Gordon, president and general manager of A. V. Roe Canada Ltd. The appointments are: Walter R. MacLachlan, president Orenda Engines Ltd. executive vice-president, administration and coordination; Fred T. Syme, president Avro Aircraft Ltd. executive vice-president, aeronautical; and A. C. Macdonald, former president of Canadian Car Co. Ltd., executive vice-president, industrial.

Orenda, Avro Aircraft and Canadian Car are all subsidiary companies of MacLachlan will continue as president of Orenda for the time being and Mr. Syme remains the president of Avro Aircraft and becomes chairman of the board. He also becomes chairman of Orenda, Canadian Steel Improvement Ltd. and Canadian Applied Research Ltd.

Mr. Gordon said the recent acquisition of Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation Ltd. had added substantially to management responsibility, and division of responsibility in the two main areas of Roe's activity—industrial and aeronautical—and control in the general area of production and administration.

In addition to retaining the president of Avro Aircraft and becoming chairman of the board, Mr. Syme becomes chairman of Orenda, Canadian Steel Improvement and Canadian Applied Research.

**Cyrus Eaton Says Spirit Of War Rampant In The U.S.**  
TORONTO (CP)—Nora Scotta born industrialist Cyrus Eaton said Wednesday "there is more spirit of war in the United States than in any other nation. Moreover, he added in an interview with The Canadian Press, the Russians and think and talk about the war more than we do."

"There is more spirit of war in the United States than in any other country in the world," he said. "The Chechaks and Ohio railway head, born in Pittsburgh, has abandoned the idea of a world Communist state because Communism made so much sense in the United States and Ohio. West Kentucky, Steep Rock Iron Mines and Port Hope, Ontario, are the largest iron mines for the Royal Winkler Fair."

"Our Mr. Dulles is talking just as the Kaiser did in 1914," the industrialist said, "and when you get swollen with pride one becomes arrogant and someone will take up the challenge."

"He said he believed the Russians were genuinely alarmed at the construction of American military bases around them. The Russians are afraid of the United States and her armaments. U.S. press and her statements would drop arms race."

**WOULD DROP ARMS RACE**  
"He was asked if he thought the United States would drop the armaments race if the West did. He replied: 'They men us to do it. We are not going to do it. It is dangerous.'"

"The only people in the U.S. who believe seriously that Communism is a menace to the U.S. are the boys on the payroll of the FBI."

**Without War Declaration**  
CHICAGO (AP)—State Secretary Dallas said Wednesday night NATO forces would "almost certainly" fight back "without waiting for a declaration of war if attacked in the field."

**Stadium For ONE Grounds**  
TORONTO (CP)—Directors of the Canadian National Exhibition have approved in principle construction of a 100,000 stadium to be developed by building on the site of the Middle East Exhibition grounds opposite the existing General Motors plant.

Mr. Syme has in address members of the council on foreign relations at a dinner meeting. Dallas said that his points in answer to questions: "American atomic weapons now being developed by us will remain under American control. We are not going to have an arms limitation agreement with Russia."
