Sees Danger in Canada-U. S. Bickering

OTTAWA, (CP) - A Newfoundland merchant warned in the Senate Tuesday that Canada and the United States are falling into the dangerous habit of bickering across their mutual boundary.

Senator C. C. Pratt, a Liberal, said during the throne speech debate that what is needed is a movement to put across to the people of both countries how they can be of benefit to each other. After his speech, the address in reply to the throne speech was adopted.

"In the economic field, reaching down to the average citizen, I think I can say there is a wall of ignorance between us," he said. "There is undoubtedly the will to understand and there is a full measure of respect one towards the other. With that background, we have an ideal setting for the promotion of mutual interest in our trading and economic problem by organized effort in both countries."

He said trade relations between the two countries can never reach a solid, sensible basis unless the general public in both countries understand the problems involved.

"As things now are, on both sides of the border, we are growing into the habit of bickering but with widespread effort I feel we can correct that and develop together on a much broader and more fruitful plane."

Nothing To Lose He said both countries have everything to gain and nothing to lose by growing closer together economically.

Referring to the problem of Newfoundland's fishing industry, Senator Pratt said the alternative to abandoning traditional markets in the non-dollar countries is concentrated development of U. S. markets. That would be a slow process.

"We love to talk about the un-fortified boundary between Canada and the United States. Don't let us be so complacent as to take such foolishness too seriously."

"With the clamor for protection in the United States against everything which we and they produce and a similar clamor going on here extending trade by trade, item by item, we are having a 'customs' shooting war across the boundary which is very real."

He said Newfoundland is entitled to special treatment in trade because she is a market for about \$150,000,000 worth of goods annually from the other provinces while selling them only a fraction of that.

Newfoundland also deserved special consideration because her produce, all of it exported, was of a type not required by countries trading with other areas of Canada.

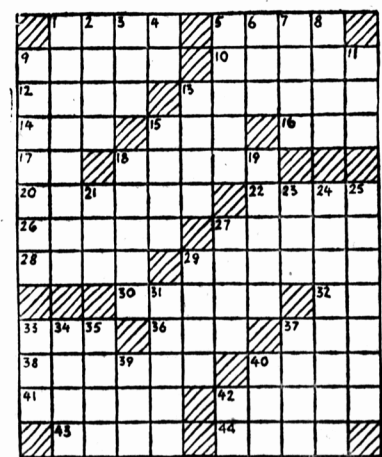
