By MAX HARRLESON UNITED NATIONS (AP)—Two years as United Nations secretary-general have brought many changes in the daily life of U Thant, but he himself has changed little. When the Burmese teacher-ambassador succeeded the late Dag Hammarskjöld on Nov. 3, 1961, he was lauded by friends for his quiet, serene, gently and calmly. He is still being praised for the same qualities—as well as for a quiet firmness which he quickly displayed.

He seems to thrive on the pressures of the job which former secretary-general Trygve Lie called "impossible." His work day cannot be cut. Sometimes, when the General Assembly or the Security Council are in session, he spends hours listening to the debates. At other times, he gets a chance to catch up on reports.
