

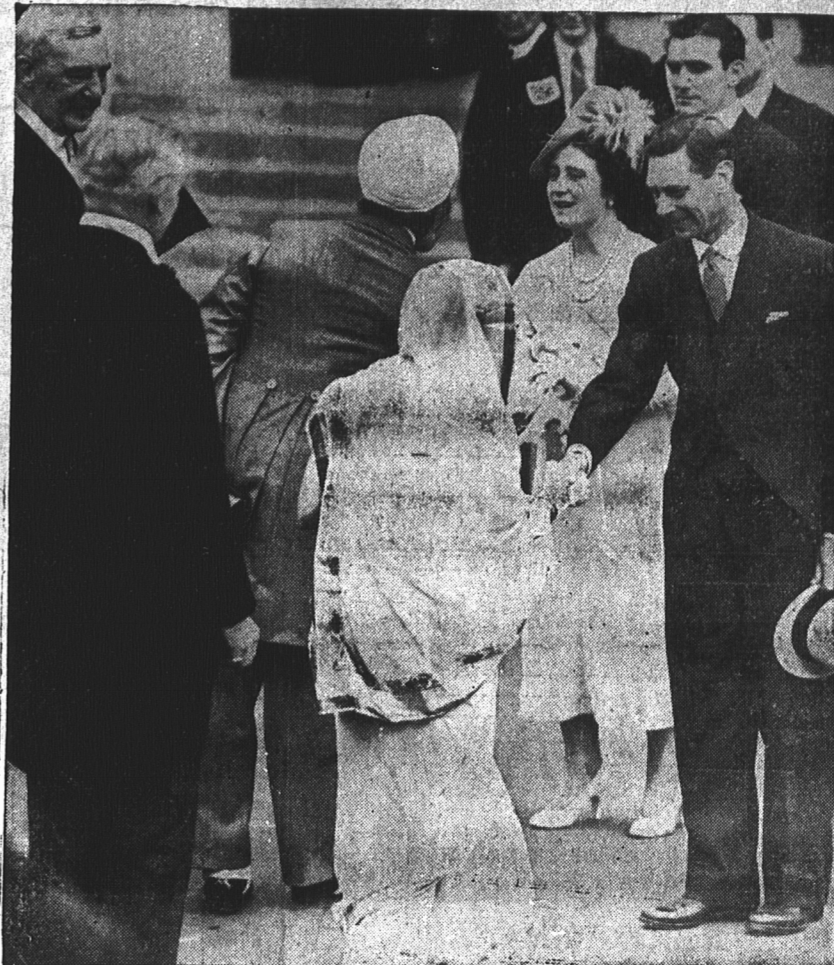

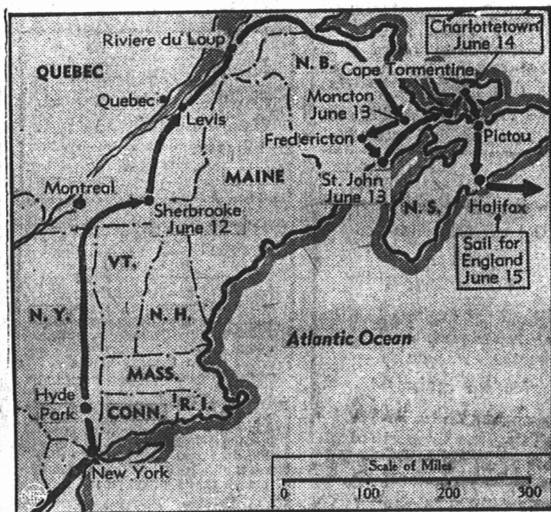

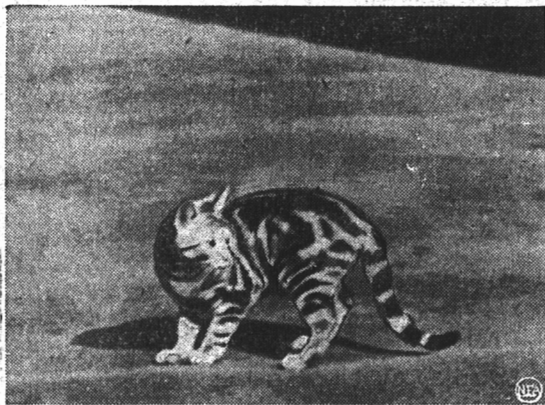
Their Majesties at the British Pavilion, N.Y. World's Fair, being greeted by Hindu subjects there.



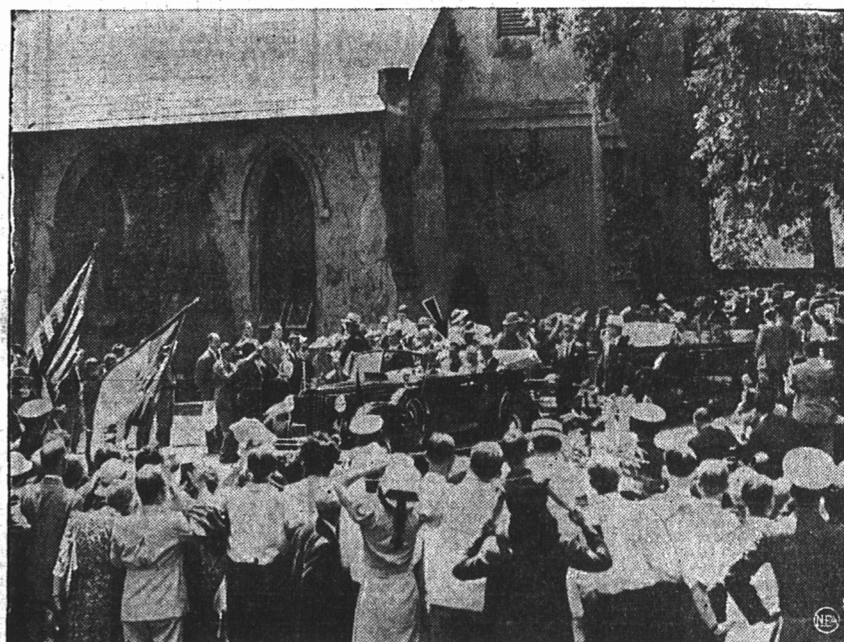
His Majesty is seen informally chatting with President Roosevelt, seated in the president's car at Mt. Vernon.
