In 1864 Their Majesties were later welcomed by Hon. George D. DeBios, Lieutenant Governor, and Premier Thane A. Campbell. The scene in front of the central building was strictly in keeping with the occasion.

At the Marine Wharf At 12:30 the H. M. C. S. Skeena eased alongside the Marine Wharf, her decks lined with Sailors standing at attention and docketed while a Royal Salute of guns was fired from Victoria Park.

Inspected Guard of Honor The King then inspected the Guard of Honor composed of 80 picked men of the Prince Edward Island Highlanders, commanded by Captain James MacCallum.

Tumultuous Cheering Cheering was deafening. Hundreds of small boats were in the harbor, nesting alongside the two destroyers.

At Legislative Building As they approached the Provincial Building the cheering increased from the vast crowds on Queen Square and adjoining streets and vantage points.

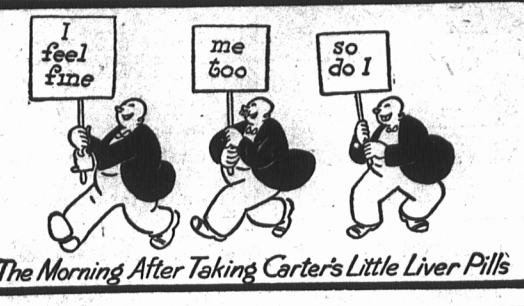
