Visits Nash Plant

TORONTO, May 10 — The Nash Canadian Statesman, first Nash automobile to be built in Canada, made its bow yesterday during opening ceremonies of the new Nash manufacturing plant on Danforth Avenue in Toronto. The occasion marked entry into the Canadian market of the first Canadian built Nash automobile. For many years Canadians have been driving Nash-made cars, imported from the United States. Nash Motors and its predecessor Company, The Thomas B. Jeffery Co., have been building cars since 1902. The new plant means that Nash cars available for the last few years from the United States on a quota basis only, will become more plentiful in Canada. It also means resumption of automobile manufacturing in Toronto after a lapse of nine years, in addition to creating employment for many Canadians.

Guests of Nash Motors of Canada Limited for the opening ceremony were taken on a tour of the plant, where production operations are explained. They watched an all-Canadian team of 300 welders, metal finishers, assemblers, painters, body-trimmers, mechanics and other auto workers build the new Canadian Statesman under the direction of Thomas S. Adams, Nash plant works manager and a veteran of automobile manufacturing.

Nash Motors purchased the plant in 1946, and since that time has completely remodeled and renovated it. A parts warehouse, larger than any Nash zone parts warehouse in the United States, will handle distribution of replacement parts for Canadian Nash owners. The plant's administration offices have been remodeled to accommodate the Eastern Canadian zone sales offices.

Mr. R. C. Greene, Greene's Garage, Charlottetown, was one of the dealers shown through the Nash plant. He expects to return on May 10th when he will display the Nash Canadian Statesman to the public there.
