

## Poultry Stiff Competitor Of Beef, Pork During Year

**OTTAWA (CP)** — Poultry emerged this year as a stiff competitor for beef, pork and other livestock meats and the trend shows signs of continuing, the federal-provincial agricultural outlook conference was told here.

A federal report presented on the last day of the meeting said the growth of the poultry meat industry accelerated in 1965, due mostly to a relative shortage and higher prices of red meats.

Chicken, turkey and other fowl took a greater share of the meat market with total poultry output projected at 770,000,000 pounds — 10 per cent higher than 1965.

Poultry prices were up a little from 1965. If beef and pork prices stay at current high levels relative to poultry, then a further rise in poultry use is envisaged in the years to 1970. Per capita consumption of eviscerated poultry this year rose to 39 pounds from 36 in 1965. By 1970, total output is expected to hit 1,000,000,000 pounds annually.

Turkey production rose 15 per cent this year, but profit prospects are less favorable in 1967 because production costs are up and the price outlook is a little weaker. Chicken broilers face a similar situation.

## Wholesale Index Eases

**OTTAWA (CP)** — The general wholesale index based on 1955-59 prices equalling 100 eased by one-tenth of a point to 260.7 in October from 260.8 in September, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported.

Index for October, 1965, was 262.1.

DBS said there were lower prices for fresh and cured meats, fish products, leather, hides and skins, lead, wood products and iron products.

The chemical products group index moved higher with price increases for fertilizers. Prices also jumped for fresh fruits, livestock and poultry feeds, tea, coffee, cocoa, coal and textiles.

## Labor Leaders Lose Appeal

**VANCOUVER (CP)** — Four labor leaders jailed Sept. 30 for contempt of court have lost their appeals here and were criticized for "setting themselves up as persons who are above the law."

Chief Justice H. I. Bird said in a 17-page judgment that the "leadership given by these appellants involves ably dangerous philosophy, not only dangerous in terms of the union membership so induced to participate, but also in terms of all citizens of this country."

Four other judges concurred in his statement in rejecting the appeals of Charles Patrick Neale and Thomas Clarke who had been sentenced to six months, Arthur O'Keefe, given four months, and Jeffrey James Power, three months.

The contempt charges against the four arose out of demonstrations at the Lenkurt Electric Co. plant in Burnaby. The

demonstrations had been banned by two court injunctions.

The four men were alleged to have taken part in the demonstrations, that at one point saw wives and children trying to block traffic from moving into the plant.
