PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Government Supporter Strongly Condemns the Yukon Deal

Messrs. McDonald and Martin Obtain Some Information.

GOVERNMENT PREPARATIONS FOR THE CONTEST IN WEST PRINCE.

An Election to be Held Forthwith

OTTAWA, March 4.—Before the orders of the day were called in the House of Commons yesterday, Mr. MacDonald, of Prince Edward Island, gave formal notice to the Speaker that West Prince was without a representative in the House. The Speaker stated that a writ would at once be issued for a new election. After Mr. Moore, of Stanstead, and Mr. Craig, of Durham, had spoken against the Yukon contract for the trade of the United States. He announced his intention of voting against the bill. Mr. MacDonald, of P. E. Island, is asking for correspondence respecting the dismissal of Jas. A. Aitken, sub-collector of customs at Montague. Mr. Martin, of P. E. Island, was informed that the Government had assumed control of Red Point wharf, October 20th, 1897, and that provision would be made in the estimates for its repair. Mr. Martin was also informed that ten tenders had been sent in for the Tignish breakwater, the lowest tender having been accepted, viz., that of Mr. John Burke, of Ottawa, for \$6,670. No inspector has yet been appointed. Mr. Martin was also informed that the Hon. A. B. Warburton was the agent in Charlottetown for the Department of Justice in 1897, and was paid by fees to the amount of \$240.19. Mr. Martin was also informed that eight tenders were received for West Point pier, P. E. Island, the lowest tender being accepted, viz., that of MacDonald & Moffat, for \$9,500.

To be Led by General Kitchener

LONDON, March 4.—The Cairo correspondent of the Mail says: It has been decided that General Herbert Kitchener shall lead the advance of the Anglo-Egyptian forces on to Khartoum.

Boy Killed By a Train.

MOSCOW, March 4.—Willie McDougall, a lad of twelve years, was killed by a train passing over him, here yesterday.

SYDNEY, N. S. W.—March 1.—The visiting team of cricketers in the final test match which began on Saturday, between Captain Stoddart's English cricketers and the Australians, were all out in their first innings yesterday, for 335 runs. At the close of play on Saturday they had scored 301 runs for five wickets down.

The British War Office scheme for strengthening the army contemplates an addition to the forces of 25,000 men. As this involves a proportionate addition to the expenditure, there will be two sides to the issue as it will present itself to the loyal taxpayer.

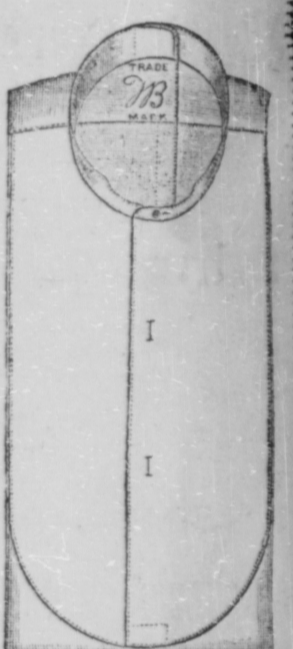
