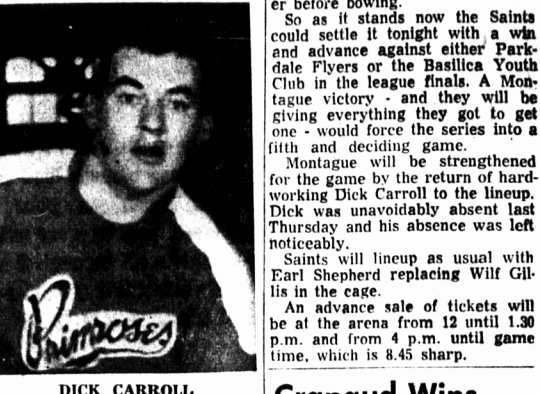

Outcome Of Suit May Effect Legal Status Of Contracts

TORONTO (CP)—An American football executive said Monday the outcome of a \$10,000 breach-of-contract suit involving a National Football League quarterback could seriously affect the legal status of contracts between professional teams and players in the United States.

The outcome of this case is important because "if we can't prove our case our contracts won't be worth anything," Aderson said.

Edwin J. Anderson, president of Detroit Lions of the NFL, testified during the first day of a civil action against Tom Dubinski, now quarterback for Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Big Four.

Lions seek \$10,000 in damages plus costs and an injunction restraining Dubinski from playing football for any other team until next May 1.

Dubinski, leading passer in the Big Four last year, joined Argos in 1955 after three seasons as second-string quarterback with Lions.

The Detroit Football Company contends he was under contract to it when he signed with Argonauts.

Anderson said the team has nothing personal against Dubinski. The club wanted to establish the legality in Canada of the U.S. contract.
