FREE WATER.—Moncton ratepayers have voted to give Humphrey's woolen factory free water for twenty years.

THE TURF—It is estimated that trotting meetings will be held this year on 1,100 tracks, and that \$8,650,000 will be given in stakes and purses.

AFTER THE BATTLE—The New York Herald says Fitzsimmons was to receive sixty per cent of the \$25,000 purse win or lose in his contest with Jeffries.

Thomas Sharkey has signified his willingness to meet Jeffries any time within six weeks. But the fight must be under Marquis of Queensbury rules, which call for a 24-foot ring.

WIFE NOT A FAMILY.—A New York justice has decided that a wife does not constitute a family. The case came up where judgment was obtained against a man who was bound to pay \$10 a week for the support of his "family." The couple had no children, and the justice said he knew of no authority holding that a wife abandoned by her husband constituted a family.

MOUNT ALLISON'S LOSS.—A great deal of sympathy is felt for the University of Mount Allison in the loss sustained by the destruction of the handsome new University residence by Sunday morning's fire. The insurance on the building and furniture amounted to \$45,000; but the loss to the institution over and above this amount will doubtless be about \$25,000, to say nothing of the inconvenience. The erection of a new residence, will of course, be commenced at once, but next year's students will be compelled to return to the old lodge and board at the academy as formerly.—Moncton Times.

A NARROW ESCAPE.—The danger of jumping off a moving train was exemplified at Summerside station on Saturday morning, when a professional gentleman, returning from the country, jumped from the express as it was going to the steamer. The train was moving faster than he thought, and he did not alight gracefully. He says himself that he struck twice on his head and once on his feet, and went thirteen feet in the air and twenty-seven horizontally, before he collapsed in a somewhat dazed condition. Luckily, however, he escaped with nothing more serious than a general shaking up.—Journal.

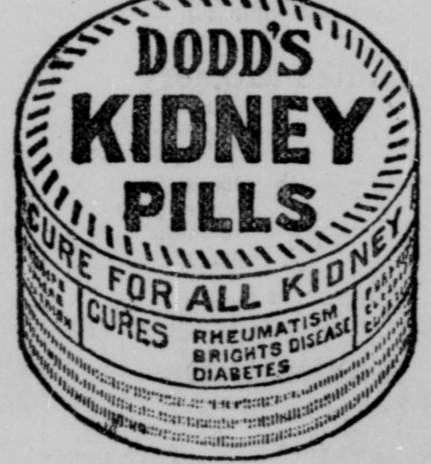
