

Bowater Co. Head Dies in England

LONDON (CP) — Sir Eric Vandtton Bowater, 67, head of the largest newspaper manufacturing company in the world, died Thursday at his Surrey home.

A tall, handsome man with gracious old world manners, Sir Eric built Bowater from a small family concern into a £18,000,000 international organization.

Of the company's total net assets, equivalent to some £20,000,000, 80 per cent came from his holdings in North America.

These included paper mills at Corner Brook, Nfld., and Liverpool, N.S.

Bowater purchased the mill at Corner Brook in 1938, marking the beginning of his trans-Atlantic empire. The Liverpool mill was acquired in 1956.

HAS IMPACT

News of Sir Eric's death had an impact on the London stock market. The company's shares fell one shilling to 34 shillings, wiping some £2,000,000 off their market value.

Sir Eric was one of the best-known tycoons in the British paper industry. Every year he invited London's top financial officials to luncheon at his headquarters overlooking Hyde Park and freely replied to reporters' questions after the luncheon.

His white hair and ruddy features gave him a distinguished air that was enhanced by gracious manners.

His grandfather started the

firm in 1884. Sir Eric went into the World War, despite severe wounds suffered at the battle of Ypres in 1917. He opened his first mill in 1926 at Northfleet, Kent, with Lord Rothermere and Canadian-born Lord Beaverbrook as partners.

He had been in ill health for some time. Doctors warned him he had been working too hard. He leaves a widow, a son and two daughters.

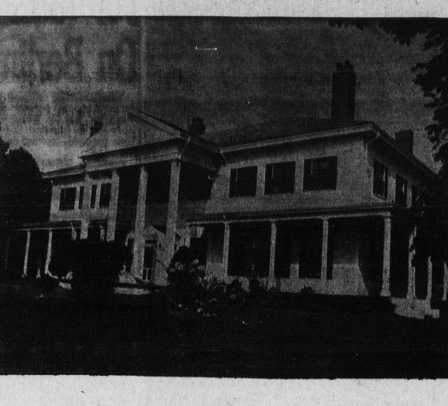
