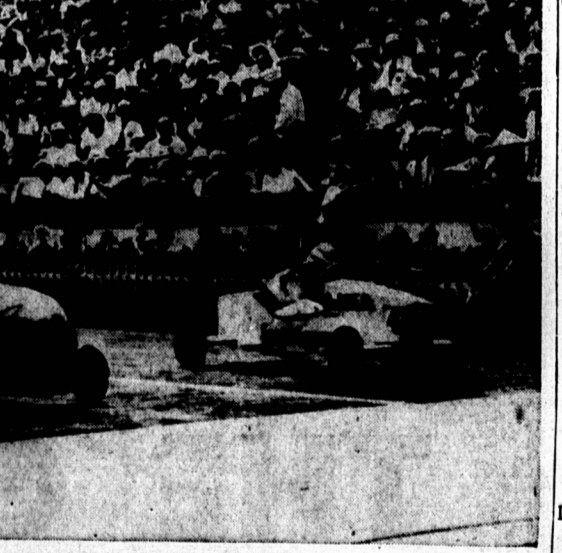
Kills swinging in time with the
