Strangely Assorted Pair Of Soviet Party Bosses

Editor's note: Nikita Khrushchev and Nikolai Bulganin are making their widely heralded tour of Britain. In the following article is a word portrait of the two Soviet leaders, written by Richard K. O'Malley, who frequently saw them in action while he was Associated Press chief of bureau in Moscow.

LONDON (AP)—Nikita Khrushchev raised his glass to a colleague and called for a toast. As their glasses clinked, Khrushchev deftly poured his drink into the colleague's glass and laughed uproariously.

It happened at a recent Moscow reception and is something of a thumbnail description of the pudgy Communist party boss: more deft than he appears, a little tricky, and fond of a practical joke.

His colleague happened to be First Deputy Premier Anastas Mikoyan, who manfully downed his loaded drink. Khrushchev watched him gleefully, looking about him like a man who has discovered slapstick.

BULGANIN SMILES
Near him Premier Bulganin smiled benignly. He's been on the road with Nikita and apparently has come to expect these little displays of humor.

To a man who has seen them at more than a score of receptions, the two Soviet leaders make a merry pair.

STRANGE ROMP
Khrushchev is outspoken, blunt and never at a loss for a word. Bulganin leans more to dignity and the slow tread. During conversa-

tions at social functions Bulganin usually adopts the head-cocked, eyebrows-up attitude of the schooled diplomat. Khrushchev pins his eyes on the speaker, usually wears a pugnacious grin and frequently has his answer started before the question is finished.

Khrushchev acts like a man who came up the hard way, never found it so good and doesn't intend to let it go if he can hold it. Bulganin seems to accept his position with more aplomb.

ROUGHHOUSE HUMOR
Bulganin, however, can be gay in a slightly roughhouse way. Frequently he seems to enjoy musing reporters and chuckles with delight when they bob and grin back.

Khrushchev is a good drinking man but the white-haired premier is right in his league. This correspondent has seen Bulganin toss off what must have been at least 15 martinis and leave under his own power, without weaving. Khrushchev favors vodka and

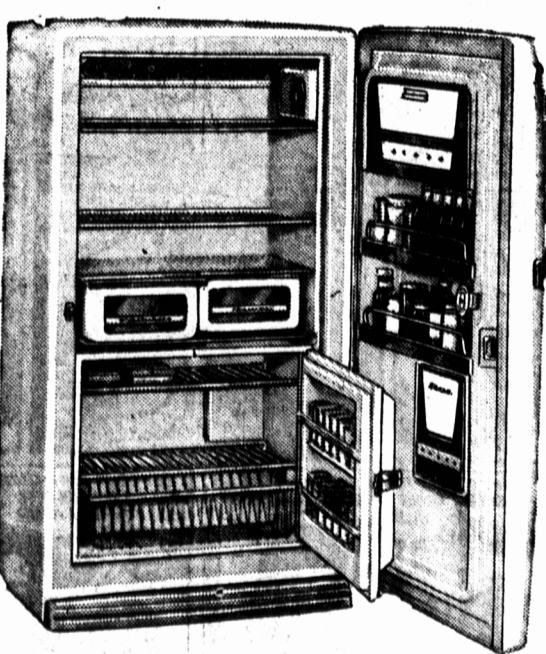

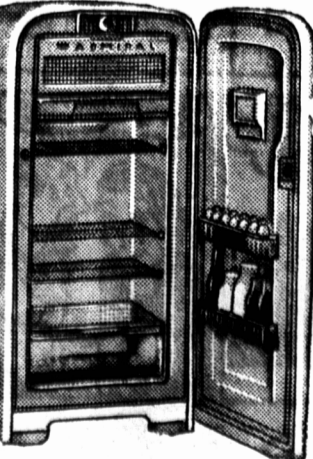
