Montreal Team Holds Big Lead

The Montreal Canadiens with Jean Beliveau, the big rangy captain of the "Flying Frenchmen", firing the winning goal took a two game stranglehold in their best of seven final round with Chicago Black Hawks in the Stanley Cup playoffs at the Montreal Forum Tuesday night, with a 2-0 decision.

Beliveau fired his winning marker in the opening stages of the second period when he relayed a shot from the stick of rookie defenceman Noel Picard with Chicago's Jarrett in the sin-bin.

The Blakemen controlled the play throughout the game and penetrated the Chicago defence more or less at will. Pierre Pilote, captain of the Hawks and the defensive ace of the Windy City aggregation, was out of the lineup with an injury and we thought his presence was certainly missed. Kenny Wharram, the speedy winger of the Reay coached outfit was also on the sidelines for this one, but is expected to be in uniform when the Hawks host the Canadiens tonight.

Claude Provost continued to do a good job of "shadowing" Robert Melvin Hull, but the "blond bomber" of the Hawks let Provost know that he recognized him as on several occasions he belted Mr. Provost rather hard. We never saw Hull play such an aggressive game as he did Tuesday night. The "Golden Hawk" didn't appear to miss an opportunity to step into anybody and if any member of the "Flying Frenchmen" wished to prolong the argument Hull was only too ready to oblige.

Once again, from the point of view of a Chicago fan, we wouldn't go out of our way to hand any bouquets to the National Hockey League individual scoring champion, but Mikita will more than likely be in better form on home ice and help the Hawks to square the series.

Lorne "Gump" Worsley has been doing a terrific job for the Montreal forces since taking over the goaltending duties from diminutive Charlie Hodge. The "Gumper's" status as a National League netminder has always created a lot of controversy and many have been known to say he isn't National League material, but he has certainly been a big factor in the success of this Montreal team, to date.

The Hawks will win by a 4-3 count on home ice in the third game of their Stanley Cup final tonight.

MONTREAL (CP) — Chicago Black Hawks beware — out to blow you over is a youngish man with a horn.

Michel Blanchard, 31, has been blowing his horn all year as Montreal Canadiens' noisiest supporter.

The Forum has rocked to blasts from his gold-colored trumpet and to the "charge" cheers which herald from a knot of rabid Canadiens supporters.

The supporters come over by Blanchard from suburban Verdun, toting a zeal that will be satisfied only if their beloved Habs triumph in the current Stanley Cup final against Chicago.

The Verdunites will miss tonight's tussle at Chicago, but they plan to hop a train for the Windy City in time for Sunday night's game.

CALL HIM MIKE

There'll be nine in the Verdun rooting section that evening and Blanchard, who likes to be called Mike, will carry along his traditional accoutrements of team jacket, a big blanket bearing the Canadiens emblem and, of course, that raucous trumpet, hung with the red, white and blue of Le Club de Hockey Canadien.

Mike is a lean, quiet-looking sort who works as a government investigator when he isn't tooting for the Canadiens.

He has a small repertoire of toots.

The chilling "charge" is sounded at the beginning of periods and when play gets dull.

It also sounds forth when Canadiens mobilize their awesome powerplay and sometimes in the wake of Montreal goals.

Then there's the Blanchard rendition of the Last Post, reserved for enemy players who get rough or find themselves thumbed into the penalty box by indignant referees.

But the officials themselves don't go unscathed by Mike's multi-decibel bombardment.
