Atlantics Turn Back Sydney Millionaires 6-1

HALIFAX, Dec. 7.—(CP)—Halifax Atlantics lengthened their lead in the Maritime Major Hockey League to eight points Saturday night by whipping the second place Sydney Millionaires 6-1.
 A crowd of 3550 watched the Atlantics turn back the club which had consistently defeated them in recent weeks when playing in the Sydney rink.
 Led by big Joe Lepine, who fired one goal and drew an assist on another, Haligonians took a 2-0 lead in the first period, split a pair of goals in the middle frame, and fired three more goals past Nick Pidsodny in a bruising third period.
 Pidsodny smashed his stick, and hurled his gloves into the side of the rink when Atlantics scored their fifth goal midway through the last period. Play on that goal was started by the rival Halifax goalie, Roy McMeekin, who flipped a long pass to Carrol Bloom.
 After carrying down the wing Bloom passed to Frank Bergeron, who scored.
 After eight minutes of fast hockey in the first period, Hugh Campbell opened the scoring. Lepine made it 2-0 late in the period when his shot bounced off a Sydney player into the net.
 Bloom beat Pidsodny cleanly on a solo rush early in the second period. Millionaires spurted and McMeekin lost a shutout on McDonagh's marker.
 Joe Lepin and Frank King set up speedy Ken Laufmann for the fourth Halifax marker after six minutes of play in the third period. Ron Rowe of the Millionaires and Billy Watson of the Atlantics were in the penalty box when Bergeron made it 5-1. Billy Watson 2.

Leading Harness Race Drivers

COLUMBUS, O., Dec. 7.—(CP)—A former farmhand from Fultonville, N.Y., William R. (Billy) Haughton, was the United States' leading money-winning harness horse driver for 1952.
 At 29, he's the youngest ever to take the title, and his earnings of \$311,728 was topped only once before, in 1951 when Johnny Simpson of Hanover, Pa., set the record with \$333,138.
 Others in the top 10 as compiled by the U.S. Trotting Association included Clint Hodgins, Claudioboye, Ont., who ranked third with earnings of \$228,340 and Joe O'Brien of Alberton, P.E.I., fifth with \$224,260.
 Included in the 25 leading money winners was Earle B. Avery, St. Stephen, N.B., with \$97,007.

INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 7.—(CP)—Detroit Red Wings, defending Stanley Cup champions and four-times first place finisher in the National Hockey League, Saturday night cut the Chicago Black Hawks' lead to a single point game with a 2-0 victory.
 The game, a playoff of a postponed game from a scheduled league game in Chicago on the United States election night, Nov. 4, drew 10,529 fans in a city that has been without professional hockey this year.
