AUGSBURG, Germany (AP)—A United States army general Saturday restricted every officer and man in his division to their posts for the weekend because of a wave of brawls in German beer halls. Maj.-Gen. Derrill M. Daniel, commander of the 11th airborne division, said he took the measure "to protect the reputation of the division and to maintain harmonious relations with the Germans." The order involves between 10,000 and 15,000 men.

Canadians Buy Ford Co. Stocks

OTTAWA (CP)—Canadians invested substantially in redistributed Ford Motor Company stock, the bureau of statistics reported Friday.

That was one reason, it said, for a sharp drop in January in net imports of capital from international trade in outstanding stocks and bonds. Net imports in January dropped to \$5,300,000 from \$16,600,000 last December. Net sales of outstanding Canadian issues increased by \$7,000,000 to \$21,500,000.

BALKS AT TOUR

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Members of the Philadelphia orchestra Friday unanimously voted not to approve a tour of Russia unless three fellow musicians are reinstated with the orchestra. Last January the orchestra's management retired a violinist, violist and cellist at the conclusion of the season because of age. A union official said the union "does not recognize any limit on any musician is qualified to perform."

STALIN DEBUNKED

MOSCOW (Reuters)—An authoritative Soviet journal Friday told Russians that claims that Stalin won the Second World War were "profoundly incorrect." The journal, Questions of History said: "In reality, victory was won by the party and the whole people, by the glorious Soviet troops at whose head stood the talented military leaders put forward by the party and the people."

Ottawa's Heavy Fire Death Toll Under Commons Review

OTTAWA (CP)—The capital's heavy toll of fire deaths last winter came under Commons examination Friday with leading opposition spokesmen urging a federal-provincial municipal conference on the ways of removing fire hazards. They coupled this request with another that the government, in constructing public buildings, be mindful of the working conditions of civil servants. Works Minister Winters, whose departmental estimates were before the Commons, said some of the Ottawa fire losses had resulted from faulty wiring, which is a provincial and municipal concern. However, Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation, which comes under his department, laid down wiring and construction standards in co-operation with the National Research Council. Fires in homes built under CMHC mortgage plans had been minor and no loss of life had resulted.
