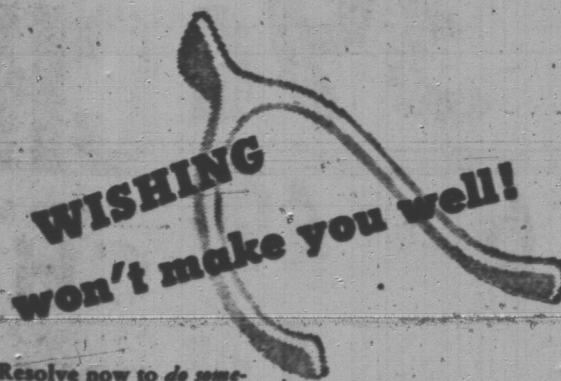

Acadian Reservations Held On Que. Constitutional Rally

MONCTON (CP) - The Acadians of the Maritime provinces are expected to be represented at a French-Canadian constitutional rally in Montreal Nov. 26-27 but local spokesmen for the Acadian community have voiced some reservations about their part in the meeting.

Some Acadian leaders told officers of the "estates-general of French Canada" here during the weekend that Acadians are concerned about their limited voting rights at the rally and the chance that their special problems as a Maritime minority will be considered only from a Quebec point of view.

Jacques-Yvan Morin, general committee chairman for the estates-general, said about 1,800 French-Canadian delegates from across the country are expected to attend with an estimated 300 from outside Quebec, including about 100 from the Maritimes.

The rally aims to map constitutional changes considered necessary to accommodate French-Canadian "needs and aspirations." Mr. Morin said "large sections of the population recognize that the Canadian constitution is out-of-date and henceforth unacceptable to French Canada."

Prison Official Is Charged With Teen Murders

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) - A 30-year-old federal prison official was charged Wednesday with murdering two teen-agers, one a Canadian.

Federal authorities issued a first-degree murder warrant against Ralph Nuss because one of the murders "was reported to have occurred on federal property. Murder is punishable by hanging under federal law."

Nuss, a work release co-ordinator at the Milan federal correctional institution, a 120 was held on two murder charges filed by Michigan officials.

Victims were Arland Withrow, 17, of Ypsilanti Township and Tom Brown, 19, identified only as a Canadian, whose body was found in shallow creek near Hartland, about 20 miles north of Ann Arbor. Withrow had been strangled and Brown shot in the head.

Police in Windsor, Ont., said they were checking a report Brown might be a Windsor man.

Douglas Harvey, Westchester County sheriff, said Nuss had signed a statement, but the sheriff declined to disclose any details.

Nuss was arrested Tuesday night on a warrant charging gross indecency, and was questioned at the Westchester County Jail.

Harvey said Nuss had them to the body of Brown about 1 a.m., after being questioned for several hours.

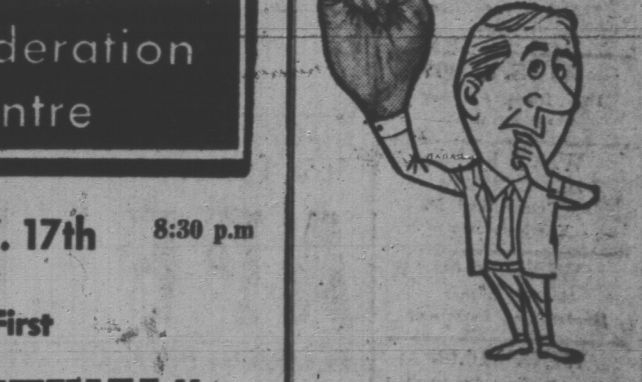
JAILS WILL BE FULL
