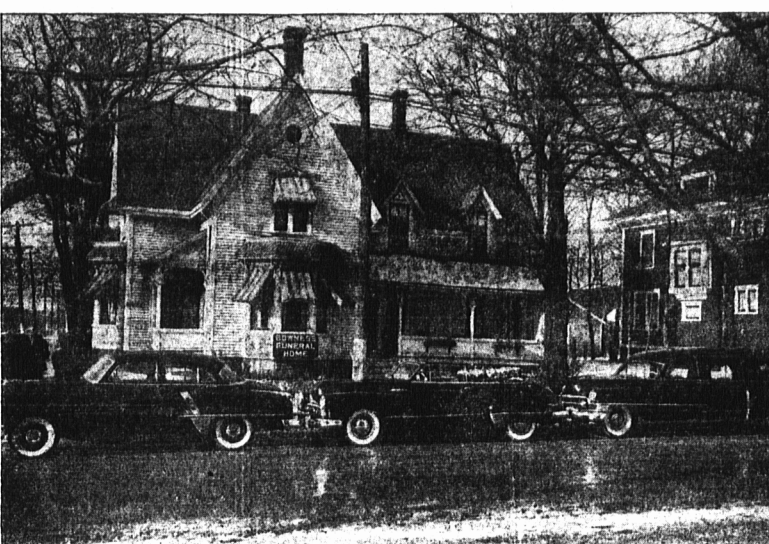

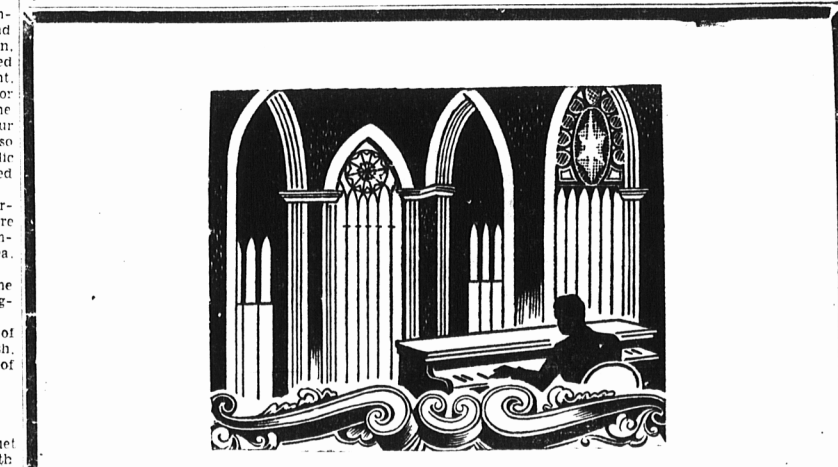
Canada To Send Money Boats, Men To Ceylon
