Says Legion Not Connected With Calendars Sale

Com. Lorne Monckley, president of the Canadian Legion, branch no. 5 reminds the citizens of Summerside that the Canadian Legion has nothing to do with one type of calendar now being sold from door to door in various centres.

"They are being sold as veterans' calendars," he said. "By insinuation, many vendors give the impression that they represent the Canadian Legion. This is not the case."

Unfortunately, some of the people selling these calendars do not reflect favorably upon the Canadian Legion or any other veteran group.

Mr. Monckley also made the statement to avoid confusion in the public mind. This year, for the first time, the Legion will offer a limited number of official memorial calendars. These will be 12-page calendars with each page illustrated in color. Anniversary dates and data on battles in which Canadians were engaged will be given on each sheet.

"Our primary interest is distributing these calendars to Legion members," said Mr. Monckley. "But we would like to see at least one copy in each school room. Here they can serve as a handy historical reference, and as a reminder of the debt which we all owe to the dead of two generations."
