

Buffalo Defeats Broncos; Win AFL Eastern Crown

Buffalo Bills captured their third straight Eastern Division championship in the American Football League by battering error-prone Denver Broncos 38-21 Sunday.

The victory sent the Bills against Kansas City Chiefs for the league title in Buffalo Jan. 1.

The Bills needed the victory to win the division title after it was left up for grabs when front-running Boston Patriots dropped out of the lead after a 38-28 loss to New York Jets Saturday.

DOLPHINS WIN
In the other games Sunday, Kansas City, which already had clinched the Western Conference title, downed San Diego Chargers 27-17 and Miami Dolphins beat Houston Oilers 28-18.

Denver's lone effective counter was the John McCormick-to-Scarpitto aerial combine

which accounted for all three Broncos touchdowns.

The Bills spread their scoring with Wray Carlton and Jack Spikes going over on short runs, Bobby Crockett taking a Jack Kemp pass 38 yards for a touchdown, Janik returning an interception 25 for another, Stratton going 22 with the fumble and Booth Lusteg kicking a field goal.

RELY ON JOE
At New York, the Jets made the most of Joe Namath's passes and Boston's errors to upend the Patriots.

Namath, having one of his best days of the season, hit for three touchdowns passes, connecting with Don Maynard on 20 and eight-yard scoring pitches and hitting George Sauer with a 77-yarder that put it out of reach in the third quarter as the Jets' lead ballooned to 31-13.

The Jets' line contained Jim Nance, the league's record-breaking rusher, and kept him from becoming the second player in pro football history to reach the 1,500-yard level.

Nance, who went into the game with 1,380 yards, carried 17 times for 78 yards and finished the season with 1,468. Namath, meanwhile, completed 14 of 21 passes for 287 yards.

At San Diego, Mike Garrett's slashing running powered Kansas City to victory.

GARRETT SHINES
Garrett, who gained 161 yards in 25 carries, scored on a four-yard run in the last two minutes of play to cap the Chiefs' yard field goal broke a 17-17 tie in the third quarter.

At Miami, rookie John Stofa, making his first start for Miami, buried four touchdowns passes Sunday and the Dolphins escaped solitary confinement in the Eastern Division cellar.

Gene Mingo booted the decisive extra point and Miami, beating Houston for the second time this year, tied the Oilers for last place in the east.

The Dolphins, in winning the third game of their maiden season, also matched the record for a first-year pro team set by Minnesota Vikings in 1960 and tied by Atlanta this year.

POLES DEFEAT BORDER KINGS
The touring Poles national hockey team defeated Lloydminster Border Kings 4-1 Sunday in an exhibition hockey game before about 1,500 fans.

The win was the fifth for the Poles on their tour. They have lost three games and tied three.

Their final game will be played Tuesday at New Westminster, B.C.
