# Shinerama '95

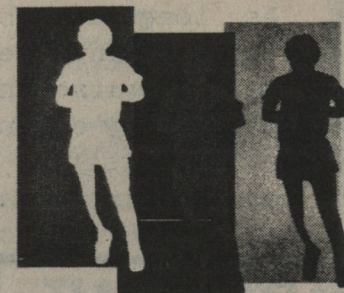
