Triple Crown Winner Dies

NEBRASKA CITY, Neb. (AP) — The 27-year-old thoroughbred race horse Omaha, who won racing's triple crown in 1935, died Friday night at the farm of Grove Porter where Omaha had been in retirement.

Omaha, chestnut son of Gallant Fox, outped the favorite, a filly named Nellie Flag, in 1935 to win the Kentucky Derby.

A month later he had taken the Preakness, and then the Belmont to achieve the first triple win since it was done by his father, Gallant Fox, five years earlier.

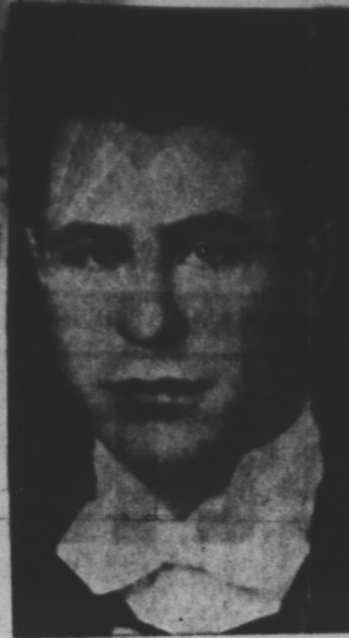
The victory of the regular-season champions cut Hershey's lead in the best-of-seven final playoff series to 3-2. Hershey won 4-2 Saturday.

Top Communists Elected In France

PARIS (CP) — Leading Communists Jacques Duclos and Jeanette Mermerech, defeated in the National Assembly election five months ago, won election Sunday to the first Senate of the Fifth Republic.

Duclos, who had been the Communists' spokesman in the lower house for more than 30 years, is the party's No. 2 leader. Mrs. Mermerech is the wife of the No. 1 Communist spokesman, Maurice Thorez, one of the few members of the party to win reelection to the assembly in last year's pro-Gaullist sweep at the polls.

Sunday's Senate elections were being carried out by the nation's "grand electors," a 106,375-member electoral college.

FAURE MADE IT

Other leading Fourth Republic politicians who lost out for the assembly but made the Senate Sunday included ex-premier Edgar Faure, a Radical, and Gaston Defferre, left-wing Socialist mayor of Marseilles.

Another ex-premier, Edouard Daladier, repeated his assembly defeat Sunday. Three of Premier Michel Debre's ministers were re-elected to the Senate and now will have to decide between cabinet jobs and upper house seats.

They are Jean Berthoin (interior), Roger Houdet (agriculture) and Edmon Michelet (justice).

Election of the Senate will be the final step in installation of the new French Fifth Republic. A new president, a new govern-

PARIS (Reuters) — A wan-looking Princess Margaret upset her sightseeing schedule Sunday and retired to the British Embassy.

The princess, who cancelled a drive in the country with Queen Mother Elizabeth, was said by an embassy spokesman to be suffering from "a sore throat and a cold."

Margaret and the Queen Mother flew here for a weekend Saturday night after a five-day visit to Rome which left the capital's society speculating about a romance between the princess and Prince Henry of Hesse.
