Dishorning Cattle.

The London Times of the 13th ult., under the head "Dishorning Cattle" says:

John Scott and Ralph Pickering, drovers, of Newcastle-on-Tyne, were summoned before the Newcastle board of magistrates yesterday by the Royal Society for the prevention of cruelty to animals, for cutting off the horns of 23 bullocks, and Richard Hughes, cattle dealer, of Coleraine, Ireland, was summoned for causing the cruelty.

The veterinary evidence given showed that the operation caused acute suffering to the animals, and the magistrates inflicted a fine of £5 and costs on each defendant.

Advanced Prohibitionists.

Toronto, Aug. 27.—At a meeting of the executive committee of the advanced prohibitionists of Canada, the work of organizing a political party, having prohibition as the ground work of its existence, was completed.

All the members of the new party will be required to pledge themselves not to give their votes or influence to any candidate for parliamentary honors whose party is not distinctly pledged to the complete suppression of the liquor traffic, and further, to support the party making prohibition a supreme party.
