Sir;
I have to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatches of the 7th 13th October, reporting your resumption of the Government of Prince Edward Island, and requesting permission to draw for the regulated allowance of passage money, to enable you to defray the expense of your return to this country.

In compliance with your request, instructions have been given to the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, to authorize payment to your order of the passage allowance of £300

I regret to find from your Despatch, that you are unequal to encounter the exposure of a journey from Prince Edward Island in the depth of the Winter. I trust therefore, that it will be an accommodation to you to learn, that in consequence of the difficulty at that season of the year, in crossing the Gulph, Sir Donald Campbell will relieve you in your Government, towards the close of the present month, it being his intention to leave England by the Steam-boat of the 19th instant. Should, however, the state of your health compel you to leave the Island before even the arrival of your Successor, Her Majesty has been pleased to command me to state, that you have Her permission to do so.
