HOW COL. SCOTT-TURNER FELL.

Gunner Knott, R. A., writing to his friends of the Kimberley siege says:—"The biggest fight we had was on 28th November, 1899; it was from daybreak to daybreak, 24 hours. We lost our commander, Col. Scott-Turner. It was at the battle of Dronfield, seven miles from Kimberley. It was a beautiful moonlight night, about twelve o'clock, when the news came for us to retire but we had taken two of the enemy's kopjes and held them for the night. Then the order came to us to retire again about 3 a. m., but Col. Turner wanted to take the third kopje. He made a charge with about 500 men, who got on top of the kopje, but had to retire, for they were short of ammunition. When they were on the top Col. Turner was shot in the head and killed on the spot. It was a beautiful sight to see those 500 men charge at daybreak, and shocking to see the poor fellows getting shot down like sheep at a slaughter. Our total killed and wounded were 76, of whom 30 died, and there were 25 funerals the next afternoon."

The Emperor William, of Germany, who it is well known takes a keen interest in the latest inventions and improvements which are applicable to military operations, has been studying the question of applying the automobile in military service, and evidently considers that it will be of great value, as he has decided to award a prize of \$20,000 for the vehicle best adapted to the purpose. A number of experiments have been recently made in this direction, and it is after considering the favorable results of these tests that the decision to award the prize was taken.

Lord Roberts has issued an order permitting a train of twenty trucks of merchandise to come into Bloemfontein. This will be the first train of this kind that has been allowed to enter the town since the occupation by the British. Hitherto only passenger trains with the personal belongings of the people on board were allowed to come in.

The Chambers of Commerce of Cape Town, Port Elizabeth, and Bloemfontein recently sent a joint petition to Sir Alfred Milner, Governor of Cape Colony and British High Commissioner, asking him to re-include the districts of the Orange Free State in the Customs union as rapidly as they are occupied by British troops. When the war broke out these districts were, of course, excluded from the union. Sir Alfred agreed to do so.

Mr Pineau in Parliament.

To a question by Mr. Martin, Sir Louis Davies gave a flat denial of the statement that Henry J. Pineau, M. P. P., of P. E. Island, was employed by the government or any member of it now in Ottawa.

All the same he is in Paris with Mr. Tarte, attending the exhibition, while his absence from the Island Legislature allows the local Liberal government to carry on business with a majority of one. Mr. Pineau was elected to oppose the government.—Ottawa Citizen.

SIR.—On referring to Hansard of the 9th inst., I find that Mr. Martin asked about certain correspondence between the Marine Department and Pineau which some reputable papers have inspected. But, of course, the Minister of Marine never knew anything about it. Indeed, to put the matter out of court irrevocably, Sir Louis shook his head determinedly and declared: "I do not know Henry J. Pineau; I would not know him if I met him."

It was bad enough to spirit Pineau off and send him to Paris, where everybody believes he has gone, but after seducing and discrediting him, to deny him thus, is the climax of political heartlessness. Poor Pineau hasn't a cent to call his own; he is sold out by Liberal benches; he is fixed by Liberal beetles; he receives correspondence from the Marine Department; he goes to Ottawa at their invitation "to get ready for Paris"; he stays about Ottawa till Tarte is ready to sail, writing right and left under the frank of "D. B. McL., M. P.," a great storm arises in the Liberal camp over him, and the first determination to send him publicly and openly has to be modified; so off he goes with the master of the administration to Paris under a bushel. What can Henry J. Pineau do to show off our exhibit of apples, one kind of which he cannot tell from another? What value is the country to get for \$10 a day for ten months and expenses for Mr. Pineau? Nothing; worse than nothing. The whole thing is the vilest piece of politics ever operated in this province, and the people, grit and tory, declare it such. After betraying the unfortunate man it is easy to deny him on the floor of the House. Before either Farquharson or Sir Louis Davies come back again from the people, however, they will know this better than they would like. If other reasons were wanting this Pineau business alone would be the death of any government.
