Russia Seeks Oil Refinery From Britain

MOSCOW (Reuters) - Russia wants to buy a "full-scale oil refinery" from Britain worth more than \$300,000,000, British Labor party leader Harold Wilson said Thursday.

After a meeting with Foreign Trade Minister Nikolai Patolichev the visiting Briton told reporters:

"Soviet trade authorities are anxious to negotiate with British industry for the supply of the Soviet Union from Britain, of a full-scale oil refinery... He believed it would not clash with Britain's obligations under Western trade embargoes with Russia for strategic materials."

The deal was not linked with the supply of Soviet oil to Britain. The Russians had not said whether cash would be paid or whether they wanted some element of credit.

Asked why the Russians wanted to give Britain the order, he said: "I think they feel they would like to develop British trade as Britain has been sinking down in the league table."
