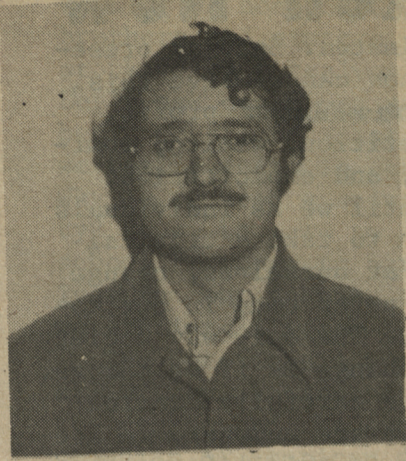


It's Election Time Again ...

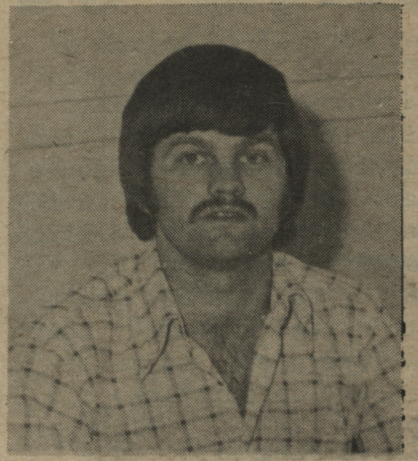

David MacRae is a Junior Arts student. To this job he brings the experience of a year on the Cadre plus having attended most of the Council and Senate meetings of last year. This, he feels is more than sufficient background for the position, since it gives him a 'feel' for happenings on campus.

He is interested in raising a variety of issues on Senate. Most important is the fact that there is no student input into course content, nor professor quality at the department level. In other words students have no say in what will be taught, who will teach it, and how it will be taught.

Secondly, Senate communicates far too little with students. He will endeavor to change this through the medium of the Cadre, among other ways.

He also feels that students on Council and Senate have too long acted as part of a social Committee and that this should be changed, some real issues discussed.

David Gallant is a student in the one-year Education programme. He brings little experience to this post other than that most important type-four years at this university.

He is interested in attempting to make profs more responsible to the students. In order to do this he would attempt to reduce the amount of paperwork and other secondary things which the prof must do, giving him more time for students. Secondly, he would penalize profs for, for example, showing up an hour and a half late for a class without notice.

Another area of major concern to him is lessening the alienation of one faculty or department from the others. In order to do this, he would hold social functions which crossed lines rather than ones which stayed within them. For example, a huge bash between the Education Faculty and the Engineering Department could be held.

Finally, he would ask that you vote for the candidate of your choice on the basis

of the issues he presents, not because he is a friend.

Charlie MacKenzie is a Senior Business student. He had held no Student Union positions but has kept abreast of activities by attending Student Council and Senate meetings.

He wants to have better contact between students and their representatives. One method he suggests to attain this is to have "pep rallies" or mass meetings in the Barn and in the residences.

He doesn't want to make a lot of promises but his major concern is to have much better contact between the reps and the students. He doesn't want to push only for his ideas but for those of all students.

Dean Doyle is a Senior in Arts. He brings a variety of experience to the position of Senate rep, most importantly his position on the Personnel Board and his consistent attendance at Council and Senate meetings. He thus feels that he has a su-

ficient background for the position.

He does not feel that there are any specific issues which he would like to push at Senate, rather desiring to push for more student involvement in Council and Senate affairs. To him the paramount concern is to get more responsibility in the job. Too many Senators have neglected to consider that their position is a representative of the students. To him this needs changing.

He would like to ask you to exercise your right to vote for the candidate of your choice and to consider carefully who the best man for the job would be.

Brian Howatt is a Senior Business student. He has had considerable experience in student union affairs. Last year he served as the treasurer of the student union giving him, aside from the duties of that position, a seat on the Board of Governors and on Council. As well he has served on the Student

Chris Brennen is in his third year as an Education student. He feels that since he is a student of the four year programme, this enables him to provide some continuity in the office. He has attended a few council meetings and so feels that he has some experience for this position.

He finds that council tends to be run by the Executive and that this tends to be the fault of the other Councillors who allow them to do so by simply attending meetings and doing nothing else to keep abreast of the issues they claim to be covering. While he does not feel that one individual can do anything to change this significantly, his single

promise was to do his part of doing so in keeping on top of things.

Chris feels that Education students tend to be alienated from the rest of the campus, especially those in the one-year programme. In order to change this, he would push for a schedule change - so that there is no practice teaching at the same time as major social events such as Oktoberfest. At present, in order to both study and attend such events a one-year student must let either his social life or studies suffer. Chris would see that there be no practicums during Oktoberfest and Winter Carnival, at the least.

Mike McCabe is a third year student in the faculty.

He has had little previous contact with Student Union affairs, as he will freely admit. However he feels that this is not necessarily a demerit, for the Student Union tends to become 'cliqueish' and therefore a new face may do much for it.

His prime concern is that the Council show much greater responsibility towards the students it supposedly represents. He would attempt to increase the degree of communication to the best of his ability.

He also feels that there is a tendency for Education students, especially in the four year programme to isolate themselves from the rest of the students. If he were to gain a council seat he would attempt to bridge this communications gap,
