S'side Trinity Girls' Choir Is Winner Of Competition

SUMMERSIDE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN — The Summerside Trinity Girls' choir was awarded the highest mark of 87 yesterday as the Summerside section of the Provincial Festival of Music continued at Civic Auditorium adjudicated by Earle Terry, B.A., B.Paed., M.Mus.

However they were in close competition with Kensington Trinity Girls' choir which was awarded 85 points in the junior girls' church choir class, heard during last evening's performance.

Earlier in the day Kinkora School received two first place awards, and 85 points for each. These were in the union singing by grades three and four as well as grades five, six and seven.

They also captured two firsts

last evening these awards going to the Kinkora Catholic boys and girls choir (84) and Roman Catholic girls choir (86).

Kinkora Dairy Ass'n. Reports Most Successful Year Ever

KINKORA — A very largely attended meeting of the Kinkora Dairy Co-op Association Ltd., was held in the school on Tuesday evening.

V. E. Duffy president, reported for the association a year-which he termed the most successful since the organization of the plant — The production of butter he said was up 10,000 pounds over 1957.

Henry MacDonald, dairy superintendent, addressed the meeting during which he advised the members that their factory had the highest percentage of 93 score butter in the province for 1958.

Storage Rot Cuts Yield

Farmers in some sections of the province are discovering that the 1958 potato crop did not keep nearly as well as the 1957 product.

One Queens' County grower told The Guardian yesterday that storage rot this spring had reduced his yield by as much as 40 per cent. One bin which graded out 250 75-pound bags ready for market last year, produced only 150 bags of the same weight this year, he said. Most of the culls were either under-sized or exhibited the ravages of storage rot.

Several other farmers in his own immediate district had voiced similar complaints, he noted.

Though admitting he could not be considered a large grower, the same farmer pointed out that the present potato holdings in the province might be considerably less than experts were estimating if conditions throughout the Island were the same as that encountered by him and his neighbors.

Dropping the price 10 cents a bag at this time did not appear to be justified, he contended.
