M. SAY, Minister of Finance of France, has requested his colleagues in the Cabinet to hasten their estimates for the budget of 1881. He intends to continue reducing taxation, consequently asks his colleagues not to propose any fresh expenditure, except for objects of urgent necessity.

THE CATTLE TRADE.—An extra of the "Canada Gazette," published on Monday, contains an Order-in-Council further prohibiting the importation or introduction into the Provinces of Quebec, Ontario, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, of cattle from the United States. No time is specified.

A NUMBER of larcenies are reported to have taken place during the progress of the races at Upton Park on Wednesday. Harness, whips, cushions, etc., were taken off horses and from wagons. In many cases men's horses were exchanged and placed in other men's wagons; and at the conclusion of the races a number of fifty and wordy rows took place, owing to the many accusations of attempted horse-stealing which was made. A set of harness valued at fifty dollars, were stolen off a horse belonging to Mr. Enman of Crapaud.

JUST ARRIVED.—Mrs. Williamson, the Nova Scotia huntress. She has with her two live moose, which she captured in Shelburne forest. The Halifax Herald says they are splendid looking creatures and well worth seeing.
