## Extension Being Constructed To End Overcrowded Schools

TIGNISH — Enrollment at the three Tignish schools, increasing steadily over the past number of years, forced construction of a connecting link to the Dalton Elementary School 104 feet by 85 feet.

The exterior will house eight classrooms, principals' room, teachers' room, two lunch rooms, janitors storage room, wash rooms and cloakrooms. Hubert Gaudet is building form.

All classrooms are expected to be occupied for the opening of the school term in September of the coming year.

## Pony is Door Prize At New Year Dance

BORDEN — Some boy or girl will be in all probability, consider himself one of the luckiest children in the province this New Year's morning as a result of a meeting of the town's Legion executive here Saturday.

It was announced at the meeting that Arthur Craig of Tryon and Donald MacDonald of Carleton were donating as a door prize for the branch's New Year's eve dance, a seven-month-old Shetland pony.

This is not the first time the branch has set up a door prize as such in this. Two New Years ago the prize was a race horse by the name of Tull Boy, donated by Stanley Mayhew of Kinross and won by a Mrs. Jack Darrach.

The New Year's eve dance will be the first since a \$25,000 renovation and extension program on the home began early in June this year. Since then an additional wing of 25 by 40 feet has been added to the already existing building which measures 70 by 35 feet and a complete renovation was made on the original building.

Work on the building, being carried out by Walter Newcomb and Kevin MacLennan, building contractors, is expected to be completed by Dec. 19, the president of the branch, Calvin Howatt, Carleton, announced Saturday.

With the additional space the main floor of the home now contains a large area for dancing along with bar facilities, dry cleaning, washroom facilities, stage with PA system and ticket booth. A kitchen is also situated off the dance floor with all facilities at hand.

The bottom floor is subdivided into a beverage room, lounge and TV room with available bar and washroom facilities.

MANY USERS

The original home was first erected in 1951 and since then its facilities have been available for mostly all community projects. Blood donor clinics are always set up in the home and all youth activities including girl guides, scouts, naval cadets and other projects are held in the home.

Since its inception the home's membership roll has expanded to the present 130 members along with a number of associate members from the areas surrounding the town and extending as far as Craupaud.

This Saturday a Christmas party for children up to 13 years of age from Borden and surrounding areas will be held and it was pointed out that the party is for all children, not only children of members. A Santa Claus will be on hand from 2 to 5 in the afternoon and treats will be given out.

## Upper Chamber Battle Is Possible Over Flag

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson's promise a new maple leaf flag will be adopted by Christmas could easily be frustrated in the Senate by a combination of political and procedural factors.

Senator Alfred J. Brooks, the opposition leader, said in an interview Saturday he expects a number of his Conservative colleagues will speak on the flag issue once it is disposed of in the Commons.

He said the 24 Conservatives in the 102-member Senate will be called to a caucus meeting to plan their strategy once the proposed single red maple leaf flag comes under a vote in the lower house.

The government served notice Friday it will invoke the explosive closure rule in the Commons Monday to choke off the 32-day debate. The showdown vote is expected in the early hours of Tuesday.

Senator Brooks, former veterans minister in the Diefenbaker cabinet, expects the flag issue to be placed before the Senate for the first time Wednesday.

heritage and the 10 provinces, respectively.

He complained the Senate has been given no opportunity by the House of Commons to discuss the flag and that it was a mistake to leave Senators off the House of Commons. These officials confer together each year on current affairs and future prospects within the organization.

The major question facing the ministers is just who might authorize recourse to nuclear weapons in the event of war. This is coupled with the question of how U.S. might shift its responsibility within a NATO system.

One attempt to answer these questions was a controversial project, for a NATO surface fleet to be applied came on the mixed nationalities, armed with nuclear missiles under U.S. control, the multilateral nuclear force.

PROPOSE WIDER FORCE

Britain has suggested a wider Atlantic force that would still leave the nuclear veto in the Western Hemisphere.

In theory, MIF is not even on the NATO agenda. But certain nations are expected to be members of NATO, have been studying this project. If and when the project is approved, it will be offered to NATO as a new component in Western Europe.

But no one doubts that the issue of nuclear defence and its control will be foremost in the ministerial minds.

Prime Minister Wilson of Britain indicated, following his talks with President Johnson of the U.S. and Prime Minister Pearson of Canada, that the British delegation will bring up the issue of nuclear defence in the full NATO session.
