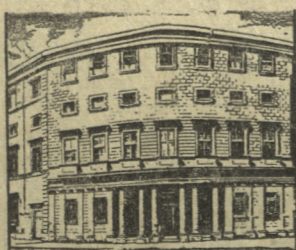

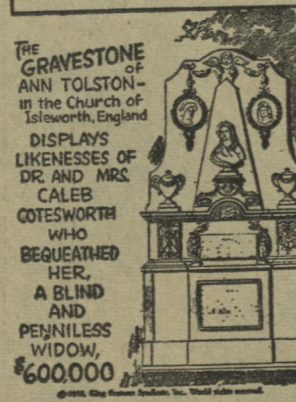

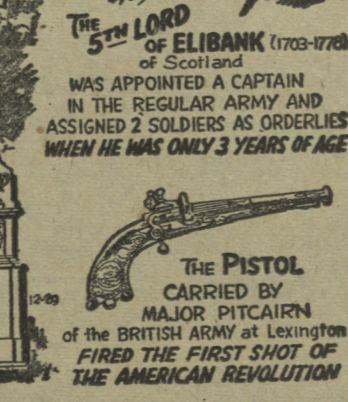

Anglo-American Dispute Ends With Hair-Splitting Decision

London (CP)—A hair-splitting Canadian compromise that neatly bisects five-millionths of an inch has provided an answer to an Anglo-American dispute over the question: "How long is an inch?" The dispute arises from the fact that the Imperial yard, a metal bar guarded in London by the board of trade, and the American yard at the bureau of standards in Washington, give slightly different answers to the question.
