

Water Meters To Be Installed

It was announced by Frank Vanderstine, secretary of the Charlottetown Sewer and Water Commission, Saturday that the firm of Ryan Bros. Ltd. had been engaged by the Commission to look after the installation of water meters in commercial establishments in this city.

A number of the meters were installed by the Water Department itself, Mr. Vanderstine said, but with the department's busy summer season coming on, it was found necessary to let this work out on contract so that the water department employees could attend to other necessary work.

He said that approximately 400 meters are to be installed in all commercial enterprises in the city. The work he said will probably be completed within a few weeks, although it is difficult to judge how much time will be involved, he added.

When the work is completed, Mr. Vanderstine said, the change-over to a metered water system for commercial establishments will be made.

The rates under the metered service will be 25 cents per 1,000 gallons for the first 35,000 gallons and 15 cents per thousand for anything over the first 35,000 gallons.
