Coins Word For Bureaucratic Jargon

WASHINGTON, Jan 18—(AP)—The man who hung the tag "bafflegab" on complex governmental language got an award today for coining the word. Milton A. Smith, assistant general counsel for the U.S. chamber of commerce, won a plaque donated by the Bellingham (Wash.) Herald.

The office of price stabilization was Smith's target when he coined "bafflegab" in writing about an O.P.S. order. The Bellingham Herald noted it and wrote an editorial saying "Gobbledegook is mouth-filling, but it lacks the punch of 'bafflegab'." Smith's definition: "Bafflegab is multiloquence characterized by consummate interfusion of circumlocution or periphrasis, inscrutability, incognizability and other familiar manifestations of abstruse expatiation commonly utilized for promulgations implementing procurstear determinations by government bodies."

OWL VOICES

Due to their unique, soft plumage, the flight of Owls is noiseless; neither do we often hear the voices of these birds, because they are fast asleep. Nevertheless, they are by no means silent. With properly tuned ears, even city dwellers may hear Owls either in the summer or in winter. Many remain in settled Canada all year round, and in cold weather they are often joined by those whose breeding grounds are farther north. Rodents, always to be found in great numbers in crowded districts are the chief attraction.

One of the big Owls is the Barred Owl, resident from northern Canada to Texas. cannot well be confused with any but those of the Barred Owl; and it is not so difficult to learn the musical effort of these big birds. The voice of the Horned Owl is the deeper, and the call follows one of three patterns, consisting of three, five, or six uninflected hoots instead of eight. The listener shivers with fear. Our occasional winter visitor, the large Snow Owl, is said to hoot and grunt too. The Short-eared owl not only grunts or croaks hoarsely and loudly but has a special flight song, consisting of ten or twelve "toots." Very different from any of these is the mournful "wek, wek, wek" of the Long-eared.

Another mournful voice is that of the Screech Owl. Never was a bird more wrongly named, and yet it is probably the best known of the family, for it likes cities. Listen for its wailing, tremulous whistle.

Owl, which comes to us from the far north. Its musical voice has been likened to the sound of "distant dripping of water from a height," and cannot be mistaken. A close relative is the Little Saw-whet Owl, so named because its whistled notes, evenly spaced and rapidly uttered, sound like whetting a saw. Its tremulous high-pitched, and rasping voice is not often heard until towards winter's end or the beginning of spring. Several other noises besides the well-known whetting, come from this bird, but unless you leave the town for the evergreen forest you are unlikely to hear any of them.

The calls of the Great Horned Owl, resident from northern Canada to Texas, cannot well be confused with any but those of the Barred Owl; and it is not so difficult to learn the musical effort of these big birds.
