# Joe Kuharich Is Appointed Notre Dame's Head Coach

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (AP)—Joe Kuharich, a South Bend boy who made good in college and professional football, was appointed head coach at Notre Dame Monday.

He was called back to his alma mater to succeed the ousted Terry Brennan.

Kuharich, who was a star guard for the Irish in the 1935-37 period, was released from the remaining four years of his five-year contract as head coach of Washington Redskins of the National Football League to return to Notre Dame.

Brennan's dismissal came through the school's faculty board in control of athletics. It caught many other Notre Dame officials by surprise.

"It came as a surprise to me and to others," said athletic director Ed (Moose) Krause, who a month ago had told a Chicago quarterback club that "Brennan will be Notre Dame's coach for a long time."

Rev. Theodore M. Hesburgh, president of Notre Dame, said last night he accepted the board's recommendation "with great reluctance."

"I don't think my dismissal could have come for anything I did off the field," said Brennan.

"So, I guess we shouldn't have lost a couple of those games." At the age of 30, Brennan is looking for another coaching job after his Irish teams lost 18 games in five years, including four this season, and won 32.

**WEALTH OF EXPERIENCE**

Kuharich, 41, brings a good measure of personableness and a wealth of coaching experience to Notre Dame, where he starred at guard under Elmer Layden from 1935-1937.

Kuharich agreed to a four-year contract, one of the longest ever given by the school. President

George Preston Marshall of the Redskins released Kuharich from the remaining four years of his five-year contract and named backfield coach Mike Nixon to replace him. His cut in salary will be at least 50 per cent.

## Shaban Says Long Count Talk Is Better Forgotten

MONCTON (CP) — Chris Shaban, manager of Canadian and British Empire light-heavyweight champion Yvon Durelle, said Monday all the talk about a so-called long count following the Archie Moore-Durelle, title fight in Montreal, Dec. 10 should be forgotten.

"The fight is history now," said Shaban, "and charges of a long count only sound like an alibi."

The grocer - fight - manager added: "Referee Jack Sharkey had a tough fight to handle. Everybody in the Montreal Forum was excited and caught by surprise when Yvon decked Moore in the first round.

"I'll go along with what Moore said afterwards that there were two champions in the ring."

Durelle was quoted in Toronto last week as saying that while Moore was down and Sharkey made two nine counts, the time-keeper counted "13 or 14 seconds" on each knockdown.
