Markets and Business.

Trade continues to be quiet and prices are unchanged. It is hard to sell potatoes at any price, 18 cents being the nominal quotation. Oats for the neighboring provinces are still bought and sold at 32 cents, though we note an advance in Montreal and Toronto. In the former city the quotations are 35 to 35½ cents a bushel, and in the latter 34 to 34½ cents. The export of eggs to England has not been quite so large the past week, and they are quoted as dull at 9 cents. Our crops are growing well and the country looks beautiful. But a succession of high winds has lessened the output of lobsters to such an extent that the lobster fishery of this year must prove a failure unless we have better weather for the remainder of the season, and the season is extended as it was last year. To close the factories on the 1st July, as has been suggested, would mean ruin for some of our lobster packers and heavy loss for all.

King's County Exhibition Association.

ANNUAL MEETING OF SHAREHOLDERS. The annual meeting of the shareholders of the above Association was held at the Law Courts Building, Georgetown, on Tuesday, 7th June, inst. The following shareholders were present, viz: Hon. D. Gordon, Jas. Clow, Esq., M. P. P., Murray Harbor North, Albert Prowse, Esq., Murray Harbor South; F. G. Boyver, Esq., Royalty; Wm. A. P. McDonald, Esq., M. L. J. Montague; Arch. J. McDonald, Esq., M. P. P., G. Albert Aitken, Esq., D. A. McKinnon, Esq., Mal. McDonald, Esq., Georgetown; Wm. Gordon, Esq., Berdorf; Captain Hugh McPhee, Esq., Roly; John Lavers, Esq., Georgetown; Geo. F. Owen, Esq., Cardigan. The annual report and financial statement prepared by the finance committee was read by the Secretary, and after some discussion, was adopted. The report showed that during the past year the management of the Association had been highly successful. The trotting races in July had been well patronized, and a considerable sum was placed to the credit of capital account. The entries of live stock at the exhibition in 1891 increased 35 per cent. over those made in 1890, and the number of articles entered at the exhibition building rose from 513 in 1890 to 616 in 1891. The expenditure on the grounds and buildings of the association now amounts to \$3,045, all of which has been paid with the exception of \$134.50.

THE CARSLAKE STAKES.—A Montreal despatch says: A writ of attachment has been issued, on behalf of George Carpenter, against the fund of the Carlslake Derby sweepstakes, which amounts to \$50,000, and which are in the hands of Molson Bank. The plaintiff, in his declaration, claims the money as a forfeited, being the proceeds of a sale of tickets in "Carlslake Derby sweeps," a lottery which is in violation of law.

BIG GUN COMPETITION.—The gun competition among the various artillery corps of the Dominion will be held at Halifax this year instead of at the Isle of Orleans, Quebec, as formerly. It was originally intended that a range would be selected on the shores of Bedford Basin, but the expense is so great that it has been decided to abandon this intention and the range at Point Pleasant which was used by the Halifax Garrison Artillery previous to the past two years has been fixed upon. The competition will commence on August 1st and will last a fortnight. "New" camp will be pitched at a point near the range.

Two trees about fifty yards from the house of Herbert Harrison, were also struck with the lightning. For about ten minutes the dust on the streets was blown about in such clouds that pedestrians were obliged to hasten to shelter, the dust being so dense that they could not see many yards ahead.
