The child, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alexander MacCormack, Tracadie Cross, died en route to the Charlottetown Hospital in an ambulance from Hennessy's Funeral Home. She had suffered a fractured skull in the accident and the subsequent haemorrhage caused her death.
