CLEAN FARMING : CLEAN ELECTIONS.

Sir,—I notice with pleasure the suggestion of Revd. Fr. Burke of the above subject—to have an exhibition of the "weeds" that are so prevalent and which must be exterminated in order to have clean farming.

I would suggest to Rev. Fr. Burke another species of noxious "weed" recently introduced into this Island which is corrupting the morals of the people. The "weed" is called by some people the "machine," and its tentacles take great hold of the people in various sections of the Province, and no remedy so far has been found for its radical destruction. I would suggest in the interests of good morals that the clergymen of the different denominations do hold an exhibition—or moral show—whereby they can calmly discuss this matter and see if they can come to any practical conclusion as to the best means of having "clean elections," thus elevating the moral standard of the churches, people and communities. By understanding the nature of this "weed"—its habitat and the soil where it flourishes best and its methods of introduction, the people would really know best how to combat it. As teachers of morals the various clergymen should lead off in this matter and Premier Farquharson might be the first witness examined in this regard.

I hope this show will materialize, and I feel confident it would prove productive and confer abenefit of incalculable value to the various communities of this province. This machine or moral weed is very destructive to the moral teaching of the churches. Eternal vigilance is necessary to prevent the further progress of this weed, and Farquharson's election would be a good field for moralists and Christian teachers to practice upon.

Hoping that Father Burke will use his facile pen and fluent tongue in eradicating this "weed" in conjunction with all other ministers of religion in this land,

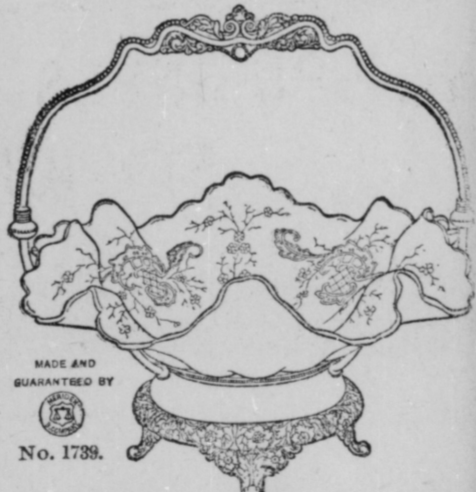
