

# See Possibility Of Restoring Shipping At Alberton Hbr.

Mr. Frank Bryan, president, occupied the chair at the regular meeting of the Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade, held in the Alberton library Wednesday night.

Following minutes and correspondence, encouraging reports were heard from members of the essay contest committee headed by Earle Atkinson, chairman of the educational committee, to assist students in writing essays on "Democracy" the subject chosen by the board, a Maritime Provinces Board of Trade film entitled "The Story Of Creative Capital" will be shown in Alberton O'Leary and Tignish during the latter part of October.

The secretary announced that the survey of Alberton harbour had been completed and the findings forwarded to Ottawa and charts for use by shippers are expected to be available shortly.

On motion a vote of thanks was extended to the secretary, Mr. C.R. Leard, for extensive work in connection with the preparation of a detailed brief outlining the many benefits to the entire West Prince area following the opening of the Alberton harbour. In the brief, copies of which were forwarded to a number of government officials, mention is made of the great variety of shipping in and out of Alberton

harbour in by gone days. Ships were loaded for places as far away as Brazil, the West Indies and the Azores.

It is the contention of the board that this port can be restored to its former volume or even increased by deepening and widening of the harbour approaches allowing entry of deep draft cargo ships.

Messrs. Allison McIntosh, Lloyd Gaudet and Ralph Adams were appointed members of a nominating committee.

Ralph Adams reported on his attendance at a meeting of the agricultural committee of A.P.E.C. His report sparked a lively discussion on the future prospects of the poultry industry on P.E. Island and led to the appointment of a public affairs committee whose main task will be to make a study of the economy of Prince Edward Island. Chairman of the committee is Lloyd Macintosh, Gerald Gamble and J.W. Don Campbell are members of the committee.

The president gave a brief report of a meeting of the Maritime Provinces Board of Trade in Moncton which he attended as a director. Mr. Alfred Parkes board of Trade is expected to be present for the annual meeting which will be a supper meeting the first Wednesday in November.

Word has been received by relatives in this Province of the death of Mrs. J.H. White in Vancouver on October 9th. The former Minnie Ramsay Gordon, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Gordon of Montrose, she was born April 26, 1876. She is the last surviving member of the family.

Miss Gordon went to Western Canada in 1906 and soon after arrival there she entered the Jubilee Hospital in Victoria, B. C. as a student nurse. After her graduation she engaged in staff duty and later in private duty nursing.

## Has Revived Old Memories

LONDON (CP) — The recent death in Montreal of Lady Allan, of the shipping family, has revived memories here of Montreal society of 50 years ago.

Sir Campbell Stuart, formerly of Montreal, writes in The Times that the Allan mansion, Ravenscrag, on the heights of Mount Royal, received every important visitor in the earlier part of the century, and "entertainments were given there on a scale that has never been surpassed in this great metropolitan city."

Sir Campbell, a former editor of The Times, adds: "The great Scottish-Canadian families, who then played a leading part in the life of Montreal, with their fine houses and magnificent pictures, all gave way to the chateaux of Ravenscrag as the leader of society."

"Those of us, now no longer young, who dined and stayed so often under that hospitable roof realize that with the passing of Lady Allan we have come into a new Canada, a Canada that is

richer materially, and a Canada, thanks largely to the Canada Council, that will be richer culturally.

"But nothing will take away from the Canadians of Lady Allan's day the memory of her gift for doing the right thing always

in the right way, and for the warm heart and public spirit of herself and her late husband, Sir Montagu Allan."

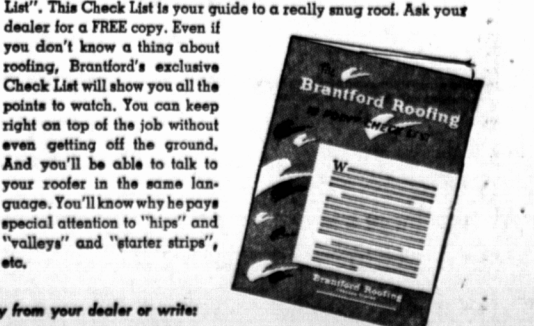
