### Ring Reminiscences

Unit every twenty-four hours. There were large piles of short chunks of wood (about 30 inches long) called "shakes", which were intended to be sawed into shingles. These "shakes" must have come from spawls and splits of the large high trees injured in falling or by frost or wind.

At the university training grounds we had a try at the weight throwing. Couldn't make a worthwhile throw of the 16 lb. hammer—never could get two or three turns in a seven foot circle. Made a pretty fair discus throw (134 feet), which was a near record at that time. Since then the Finns and Swedes have done around 160 feet which is super excellent work.

We boarded an American pas-

enger steamer about March 15th from Seattle to Skagway, with calls at intervening ports in the "pan-handle" of Alaska — Ketchikan, Wrangell, and Juneau. Big lumber mills and salmon canneries appeared to be the principal industries in those towns.

The "pan-handle" extends for hundreds of miles down the coast from the main body of the territory of Alaska. It also extends ten marine leagues (30 miles) inland. The title to the long narrow strip of coast was obscure, and was the cause of a long and bitter disagreement between Britain, Canada, and the United States.

It was known as the Alaska Boundary Dispute, and was settled by arbitration in the 1890's, following the claims of the United States almost in total. Alaska had been in the possession of Russia and was sold to the U.S. in 1867 for a

mere pittance, and there is little doubt that the disputed panhandle was included in the bargain.

The names Lord Alverstone, Sir Julian Pauncefote and U.S. Secretary of State Hay recur to memory in connection with the arbitration. I have heard Canadians curse Lord Alverstone for "selling us down the river", casting the vote which gave so much of the B.C. coast to the U.S. The Russians sold the strip of coast line to the U.S. — whether or not it was legally theirs to sell is another question. It had been the ethics of Russia, indoctrinated by Peter the Great, to "acquire" all loose territory. Appropriating Alaska from the North American continent was a bold example of their acquisitiveness at that time, and it would appear that the mentality of present Russian leaders is infected with the same bacilli.

No doubt the Russians had es-

tablished fishing posts down along the Canadian coast line thereby acquiring a sort of "squatters rights". The coast was held in poor regard by Great Britain, and the Russians remained in possession of their fishing and trading posts.

Their economists and financiers couldn't visualize the rich potentialities of the territory — fish, lumber, minerals, etc., but an astute U.S. Secretary of State, Seward, was able to buy the whole territory for a comparative trifle in

cash in 1867. The boundary is well defined by glaciers, streams, mountain ridges, etc. The writer has been privileged to see some of the markers.

The 147th meridian of west longitude forms the main border be-

tween Alaska proper and Canada. Hundreds of men were engaged during the summer of 1910 in close-cutting a strip about 100 feet wide on each side of the boundary and building cairns and stone monuments — in order that there should be no further uncertainty. They came from all parts of the United States. I met one of them at Vanceboro, Maine, ten years afterwards — knew him by his height (6 ft. 7 in.). I had had a friendly boxing bout with him in Dawson.
