Manufacturers in Manitoba Follow Up Trade Contacts

WINNIPEG (CP)—Manitoba manufacturers have started to follow up contracts made with United States buyers during a one-day trade show held here. Fifty-eight U.S. buyers representing firms selling more than \$100,000,000 of goods a year, through 3,000 stores were flown here by the Manitoba government for the Manitoba Samples Show. During the "fly-in-and-buy" visit buyers from New York and the American Midwest saw what goods are being manufactured in Manitoba, met Manitoba manufacturers and set up contracts for future sales trips south of the border. A least one Manitoba manufacturer has a store stand in New York to develop possible markets revealed by the show. The buyers showed enthusiasm for the sample show idea. They inspected articles ranging from sporting goods to jewelry made from Manitoba rock. The buyers said they wanted "excellent presentation" and a Detroit official said "Manitoba manufacturers will be welcome callers at our factory." Gov't Will Not Interfere With CBC Program
