



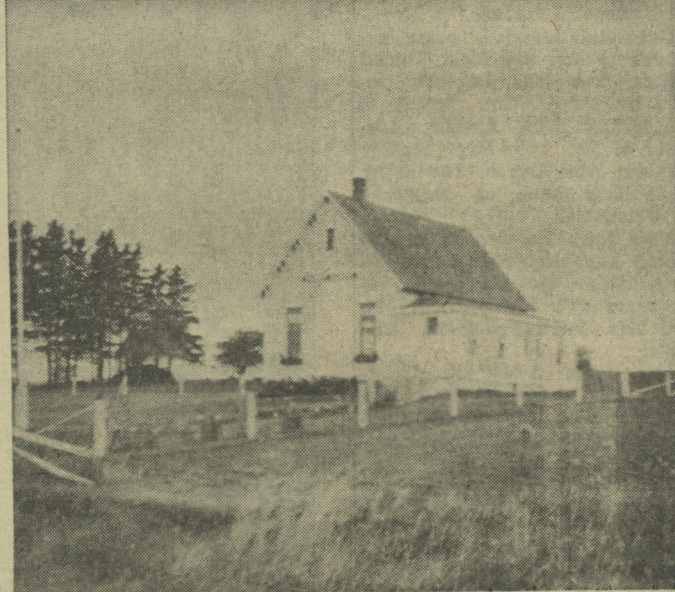

SPEED UP SHIPMENT
KARACHI (Reuters)—Finance Minister Fleming of Canada said Friday a shipment of 33,000 tons of Canadian wheat to relieve Pakistan's food shortage will be speeded up and moved next month. Fleming discussed economic co-operation between Canada and Pakistan when he conferred with President Iskander Mirza and chief martial law administrator Gen. Ayub Khan. Fleming said Canada has given a total of \$96,300,000 in aid to Pakistan in the last seven years.
