Hello there. It happened because of "National Week of Action"! Yes, it is true that a student committee of UPEI's Canadian Federation of Students consolidated our university community. I'd like to congratulate their successful efforts at this time.

In line with funding, my next focus is on the appeal process. First of all, you should realize that if you aren't satisfied with your loan assessment for a legitimate reason, you have the right to appeal. Also, many appeals are handled quite routinely through the Student Aid branch of the Department of Education.

Steps for appealing your student loan:

1. There is no deadline for appeals. Although it is in your interest to file an appeal as soon as possible.

2. You can appeal if:
- you didn't receive the amount of award requested.
- if your award was adjusted.

3. You may appeal any of the following: assessed student contribution, assessed parental contributions and/or assessed educational costs. The usual basis for appeal is an extenuating circumstance. However, even if your reason isn't a common one don't hesitate to appeal if you can't meet

your expenses for the coming year.

4. Your student contribution may be appealed:
- due to exceptionally low income
- due to unemployment
- if you attended intercession courses or summer school.

5. Parental contribution appeals will be considered in the case of funerals, leal feel, weddings, dependent relatives, unavail-

able home emergency home repairs, strikes, unemployment, or illness that affected income.

6. Appeals for educational costs will be considered based on an increase in

the cost following the original application for loan.

Now, because it is will into the second semester and not all of our students are PEI residents, I will include appeal deadline information for the rest of Canada:

New Brunswick - February 28, 1988

Nova Scotia - February 15, 1988

Newfoundland - 5 weeks before period of study ends

Quebec - Immediately after your notification of award

Ontario - 8 weeks before period of study ends

Manitoba - Immediately after notification of award

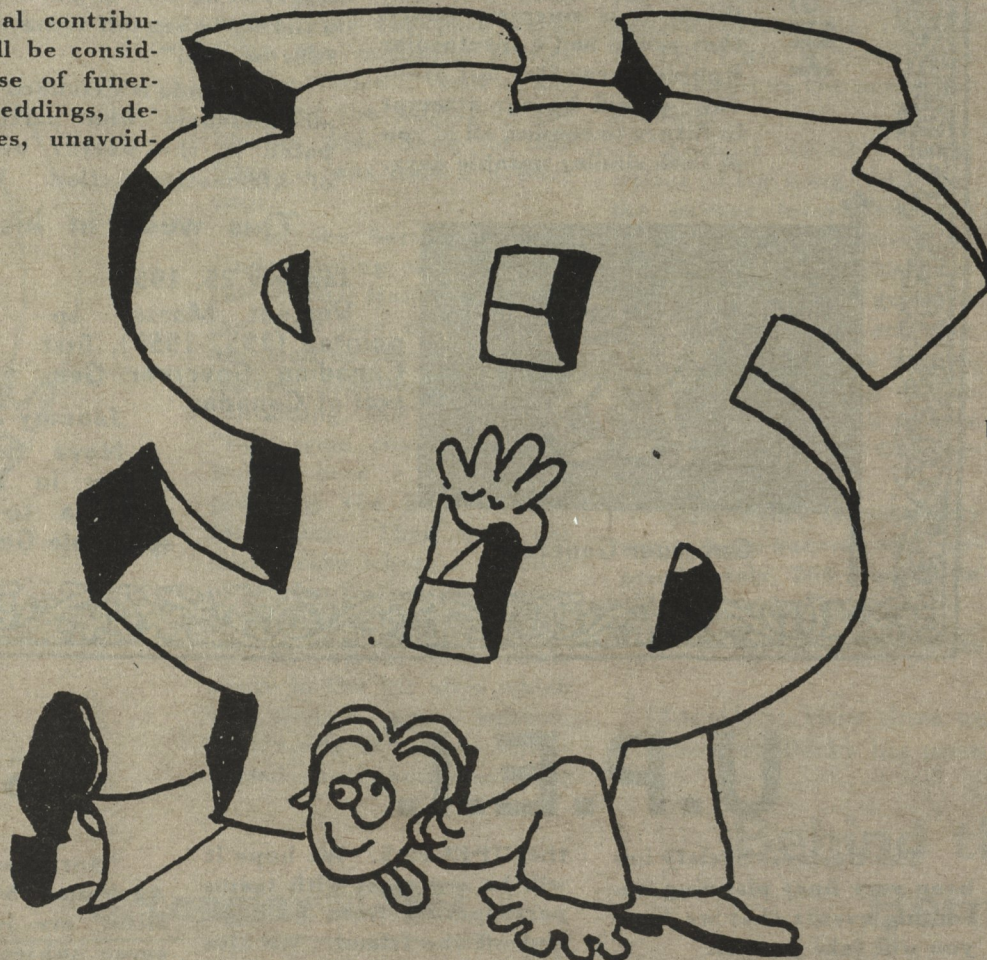
Saskatchewan - 45 days before period of study ends

Alberta - Immediately after your notification of award

British Columbia - 10 weeks prior to period of study ends

Northwest Territories - Immediately after notification of award

The following is a listing of summer job opportunities:

STUDENT PLACE-MENT OFFICER— Canada Employment Centre - must be full-time student and returning. Deadline - January 29, 1988.

SEAFOOD PRO-MOTION COMPETITION - DEPT. OF FISHERIES - PROV. GOVERNMENT - Must have outgoing personality, experience dealing with food, preferably some training in the field of Home Economics. Deadline date is January 29, 1988.

COSEP - CAREER ORIENTED SUMMER EM-PLOYMENT PROGRAM - must be full-time student and returning to studies in the fall. Deadline for application is February 28, 1988.
