RESCUED IN MID-OCEAN.
A London special to the New York Herald says the steamer Normanna arrived at Southampton on Friday morning. The captain gave a detailed account of the rescue of the crew of the British ship Arno in mid-ocean, three days out from New York. The Arno was sighted with a heavy list, and was signalling for help. The captain asked the Normanna to take off the crew, the ship being expected to sink. The rescue was commenced in heavy seas. The first boat sent to the Arno capsized, but no lives were lost. Other boats were sent out, and finally, after hazardous and thrilling incidents, the crew of twenty men and women and a baby were rescued. The boats could only approach within fifty yards of the Arno, and men were rescued with a life buoy line. The baby was dropped over in a canvas bag and was hauled in this way into the boat. Waves were running thirty feet high. The rescue occupied eight hours, and the last boat load was brought in late dark. A sailor jumped overboard and swam alongside a woman till the boat picked her up. The Arno was expected to go down. The passengers on board the Normanna collected 2,000 marks for the rescuing crew.

FOR TREATING CONSUMPTIVES.
It is a well-established fact that tuberculosis, the most fatal disease known to modern medical science, may be cured if taken in the earlier stages and treated under favorable conditions. The greatest difficulty in dealing with consumption is the infectious nature of the disease, and the fact that isolated cases crop up everywhere in all countries and at all seasons. It is most prevalent in moist climates in the temperate zone, perhaps nowhere more so than in Canada, Great Britain and the United States. An authority says that in Scotland seven thousand persons die of it annually, and that there are in that country seventy thousand persons continually suffering from tubercular affections. Possibly the statistics for Canada would be equally appalling, and an agitation is now progressing for the establishment of a consumptive hospital in some favored locality in Canada, Great Britain and the Rocky Mountain region. Consumptive hospitals have existed for many years, both in England and America, perhaps the oldest being that at Ventnor, in the Isle of Wight, which was founded in 1850. The establishment of such an institution in this country would be as a relief from death for many who are now marked as victims, but the cost of treatment must necessarily be met; and all those who possess of considerable means, and unfortunately the great majority of consumptive cases are found among the poorer classes. The movement, which seems to be agitated in our country, is a most commendable one, and is watched with a good deal of interest by the medical profession as well as by laymen.

SALE OF STAMPS.
The sale of the Levison collection of postage stamps in New York closed last week. The sale consisted of the stamps of South and Central American countries, all in unused condition and pretty nearly complete. The rarities were sold at satisfactory prices.
At Buenos Ayres, three pesos, green, brought \$19; a four pesos, vermilion, \$47; while the five pesos, orange, the rarest in the set, sold for \$51. It was bought in by Mr. Siebert, of the Hamilton Bank Note Company. This concern manufactures the stamps of all the Central American countries at present. Mr. Siebert bought a two and one-half centavo, of Bahia, of 1858, for \$50.
The four issues of the Dominican Republic sold for \$26 and \$31.50, respectively. The total of the three nights' sale amounted to \$10,311.41.
It was learned the sale that two years ago one stamp of British Guiana, forming a part of the celebrated DeCoffet collection, was purchased by the auctioneer, Albrecht & Co., for the extraordinary sum of \$1,000.

WON'T ALLOW MEDDLING.
A Washington despatch to the New York Herald says: Great Britain will not tolerate any interference by the United States in the boundary dispute with Venezuela. It is understood the British Government informed Ambassador Bayard that it would insist upon the boundary line surveyed in 1841 by Sir Robert Schomburgk.
A great deal will now depend upon the action of the two Governments in the disputed territory. Both Venezuela and Great Britain have established small outposts along the Guvuni river, which flows through the centre of territory in controversy. These outposts overlap each other, some of those established by Venezuela being nearer to the territory which is admittedly British than some of the British outposts. The situation is such that a hostile clash may be brought on at any time.
It is stated in Washington by persons in a position to speak with authority that as soon as Venezuela is convinced that Great Britain has finally declined to arbitrate or settle the boundary dispute as suggested by the United States through Ambassador Bayard, the Southern republic will respectfully but resolutely resort to what she regards as her only course—a resort to force.
Venezuela fully recognize the great military strength of Great Britain, but it is declared that her people are ready to see their homes and their cities desolated and laid in ashes than submit to what they regard as national dishonor.

A despatch to the London Daily News from Constantinople, says it is reported that the Porte has prepared a scheme of Armenian reform for submission to the powers. According to this scheme two or three of the provinces will be united under a governor-general, under whom fifteen state educated Armenians will be appointed Caimahans, and ten Turkish mutes will be appointed Sariffs. It is even stated that Turkan Pasha, late of Crete, or Chakir Pasha, formerly ambassador to St. Petersburg, will be made governor-general, and that Von Goltz Pasha, a German in the Turkish Government, will organize a gendarmerie to be composed of Christians and Mussulmans.

Tuscany has been shaken by earthquakes several times this week. At Tredizio a dozen houses collapsed. Seven dead bodies have been removed from the ruins and eight persons are missing. At Monte Pulciano, in Central Italy, roofs were shaken down and three buildings were wrecked. Two persons were killed and ten or twelve were injured. The earthquakes have been accompanied by the heavy rain. The Government has sent a geologist to visit the places where the shocks were most violent.

THE CUBAN REVOLUTION.
News has been received from Santiago de Cuba that the revolutionary generals, Antonio Maceo, Fios Crombia and Milanos, left Port Limon, Costa Rica, on March 21, on an Atlas Line steamer. It is reported that their purpose is to join Jose Mari in some Haytien port off Maximo Gomez, in the vicinity of Fortune Island, thence to land on the eastern coast of Cuba, where Spanish warships are cruising off the coast in the hope of interrupting the insurgent expeditions.
General Bartolome Maso was chosen provisional commander-in-chief of the Cuban revolutionary forces in the province of Santiago, pending the arrival of General Gomez. Gen. Maso has issued a proclamation in which he repudiates all acts of brigands as foreign to the programme of the revolution. He pledges himself that the revolutionary forces will protect the persons and property of non-combatant Spanish residents on the island and will respect the wives and children of the country in the field. General Maso and his lieutenants in that province have from 3,000 to 5,000 men under arms. About one-fifth of the men are mounted as cavalry, but they lack arms and ammunition.
Private advices from Port au Prince, Hayti, indicate that President Hippolyte is lending active support to the Cuban revolutionists.
