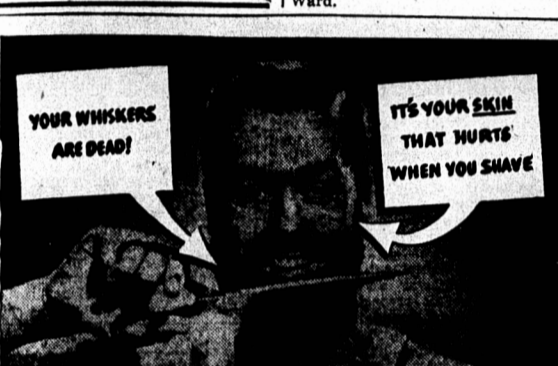

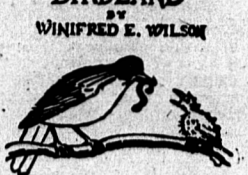

#### THE ROBBER

Singing his tinkling summer song, Mr. Myrtle Warbler bounced back and forth from one spruce tree to another, waiting for his wife to make up her mind which was most suitable located for a residence. The little vibrant call they both used seemed to be for conversational purposes. It was easy to tell them apart as they raced past, because his back had a decided blue-black tinge whereas hers looked brownish. And when for an instant he paused, his dark patches showed really black. But they wore the same pattern, had the same four bright yellow cheeks, and two white wing bars.

At last the decision was made, and a nest of evergreen twigs, grasses, and rootlets began to take form, saddled on a spruce bough well out from the trunk, and 15 feet or so above the ground. Then Mrs. Myrtle was seen picking fluff from the tied ends of the clothesline. Evidently the mattress was to be started. However, the home was never completed, for a big wind sprang up that night, rocking the branches of these trees that stood on the edge of a clearing. In the morning a filmy little mist lay on the grass some yards distant.

Housekeeping was thus delayed, but the couple was not daunted. In a very few days they had chosen another site—a spruce quite close to our bungalow. But it was late in the year to begin afresh. Even the Cedar Waxwings had completed their home before the Myrtle Warblers had got to the point when some soft material was needed. Yes, Mrs. Myrtle spied in their nest just what she wanted—a fluffy, white and buff Owl's feather. So when neither Waxwing was looking she grabbed it.

The nest was too high for anyone to see the eggs, but they must have been white, speckled with brown like other Myrtle Warbler eggs. Both parents flew back and forth a great deal, so we could not tell whether or not he did any incubating. But once the babies were out of their shells mother and father took turns flying high over the bungalow roof, bringing food.

It was July 24 when the three little downy balls took to their tiny wings. They were a curious mixture of dark and light, but they already had the characteristic indication of yellow on their sides and two diminutive, white wing bars.

The family of five kept coming back and visiting the home tree off and on right up to September 26.

I. M. T. bus will leave Summerside Armouries at 1730 hours and stop at Kensington Corner at 1750 hours.

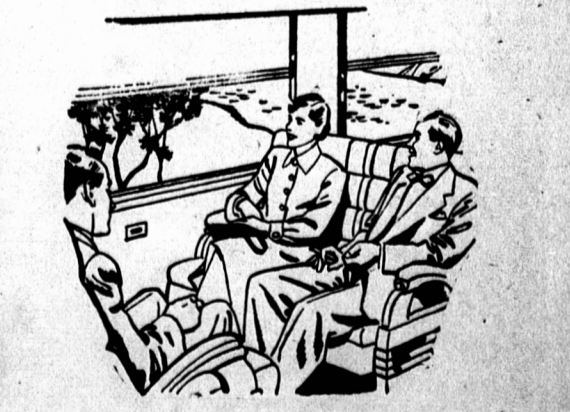
