Health Official Airs Obstacles In Alcohol Ed.

Obstacles to learning about alcohol were dealt with by Dr. J.E. Carlen, Fredericton, N.B., in his address to the alcohol education conference at the Basilica Recreation Centre yesterday. Dr. Carlen, a retired school supervisor, is director of alcoholic education and rehabilitation for the New Brunswick department of health. A representative of Alcoholics Anonymous Family Group spoke to the conference on the work of that group. Members learn they cannot stop alcoholism by drinking, she said, but can regain confidence and hope to help them to bring meet the obstacles of whether to teach their personal beliefs or something they, or a large part of the population, do not believe.
