The squeeze is occasionally a very potent weapon, since declarer may sometimes find himself able to manufacture a critical trick with it.  
However, some squeeze positions are not easy to recognize, and, as a result, many opportunities to execute a successful squeeze are by-passed either through ignorance or oversight.  
Take a hand like this one, which is where the squeeze—which is far from evident—acts as a stepping stone to the establishment of a crucial trick.  
West led the king of clubs, which held, and continued with the queen. Declarer took the ace, ruffed a club, and then played a low heart, West following low.

# Speculators Still Betting Price Of Gold Will Go Up

TORONTO. (CP)—The United States has issued an emphatic "no," but some speculators still are ready to bet the price of gold will be going up.

Breathing new hope into the speculators was the annual report of the European Monetary Committee, adviser to the European Common Market on money affairs, which said the six ECM countries likely will draw on the U.S. reserves for more gold this year than last.

If this trend developed, it could speed up the drain of the U.S. gold reserves, already considered by some economists to be dangerously low.

The speculators are gambling the drain will force the U.S. to raise the price of gold from \$35 an ounce. This naturally would benefit some Canadian gold mines, and the price of shares of some of these companies have risen sharply this week.

An index set up by the Toronto Stock Exchange to measure the movements of gold stocks is up four points this week, with individual stocks adding more than \$1.

**FELL BACK SHARPLY**  
Gold stocks were run up heavily two months ago on similar speculation, but fell back sharply after the U.S. treasury department issued a statement saying any guessing on the price of gold would "inevitably end up on the losing side."

Some official recognition of the speculation came last week at the annual meeting of the Canadian Metal Mining Association when W. S. Row, the association's outgoing president, noted interest in the question was at its highest peak in some time.

"It is noteworthy that important bodies such as the national planning association of the United States should recommend to their government that the time had come to double the price of gold," said Mr. Row, who is chairman of Keer Addison Gold Mines Ltd.

It remains to be seen whether and how long the present price of gold can be maintained under the pressures to which it becomes increasingly subject.

The U.S. Congress has moved to lift the 25-per-cent gold backing previously required for federal bank reserves.

"There is a practical need for this action: To provide reassurance for foreign governments and central banks the United States will continue to supply gold to them at the established price of \$35 an ounce and thus protect the position of the U.S. dollar, firmly linked to gold as the anchor of the international monetary system."

Despite the apparently increasing pressure on the U.S. gold supply, however, some observers are convinced the key to the question of a possible gold price increase lies in the political field—at least until a full-fledged crisis boils up.

**WILL RELEASE GOLD**  
This will release almost \$5,000,000,000 worth of gold to meet obligations from foreign countries wishing to exchange their U.S. dollar holdings for the yellow metal—which the U.S. does at its fixed gold price.

Many monetary analysts believe this will relieve the pressure on the U.S. gold holdings, but others argue it will be taken by foreign countries as proof of the weakness of the U.S. position and actually increase the demand for gold.
