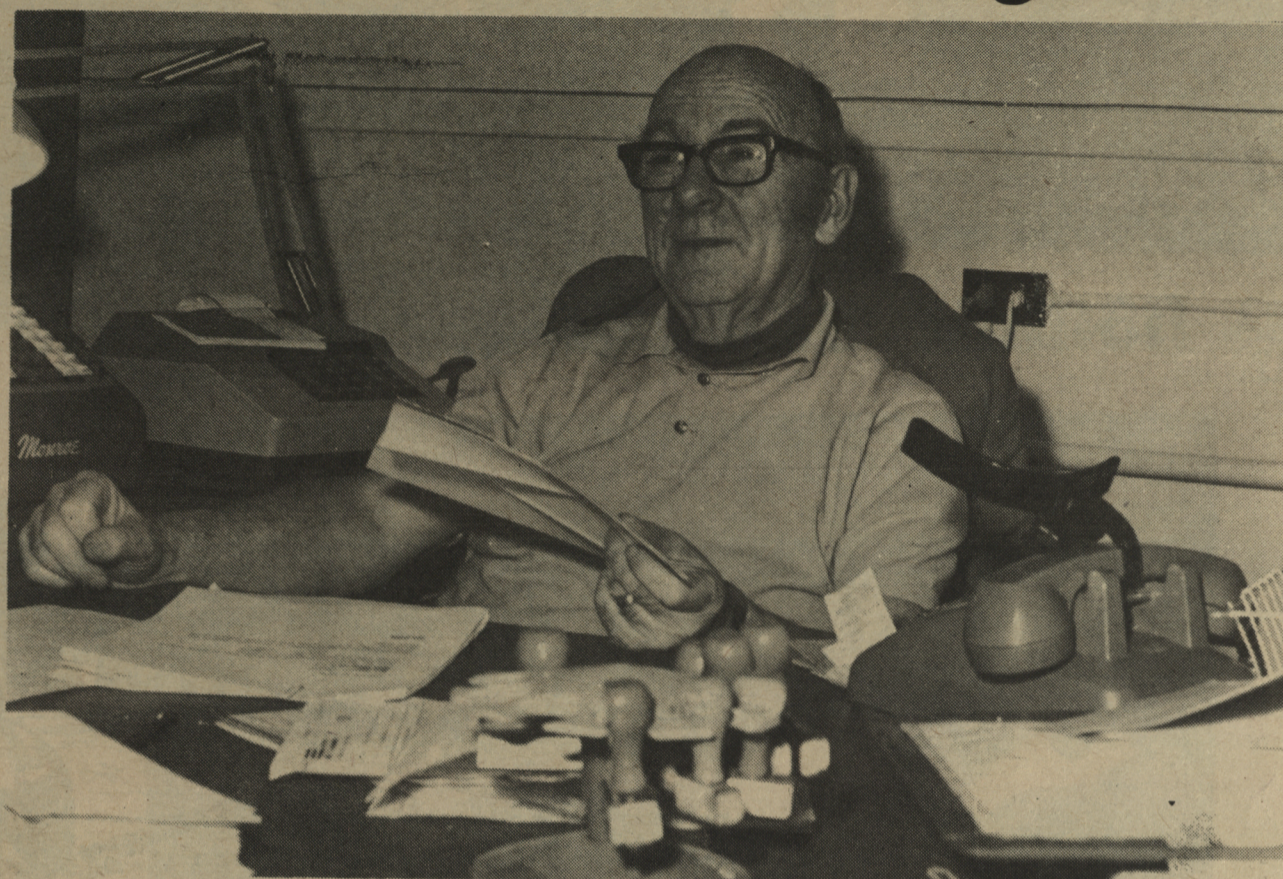


S.U. Appoints Business Manager

The U.P.E.I.S.U. has hired a new business manager, Mr. J.T. "Mickey" Place, primarily to assist the treasurer in his functions and to provide continuity to the Student Union in general.

Mr. Place was selected from a potential 14 applicants. The pre-screening and interviewing of applicants was done by a committee composed of Pat Duffy, S.U. President; Lennie McCardle, S.U. Treasurer; and Dennis Clough.

The Student Union has set up an advisory committee comprised of Dennis Clough, Comptroller, who has a permanent position on the committee; a representative from the faculty, presently Bob Ellison on a 3-year term; a representative from the alumni, presently Jim Larkin, with a 2-year term; and the President and Treasurer of the S.U. This panel was structured so as to provide as much continuity as possible. The responsibility of the committee is to assist the Business Manager in orientating himself to the University environment, and to advise, if so requested to do so, on any controversial issues. The main purpose of the panel is to see that in the event



of a dispute between the S.U. and the Business Mgr and the Student Council wishes to dispense with his position, the committee can evaluate the situation and see that he is being treated in a fair and just way.

Mr. Place comes to us from CFCY where he had worked as Accountant Office Manager from 1947 to 1971. He was educated at P.W.C. and the American Institute

of Banking. Mr. Place took an early retirement from CFCY, and as he has always been interested in the university, (he has been in the press box at almost every University hockey game since 1947), he chose to join us.

The S.U. Executive has placed a great deal of trust and responsibility in the office of Business Manager and they feel that Mickey Place is

the type of man who will accept the duties of his office and carry them out in such a manner as to bring confidence and pride to this position. The Executive extends a warm invitation to any and all students to drop down to the office to meet Mr. Place.

Mr. Place has signed a one-year contract and assumed the duties of his office on January second.

All in all, we had a great time together and to quote one of the students, "It was a very meaningful way to spend Christmas."

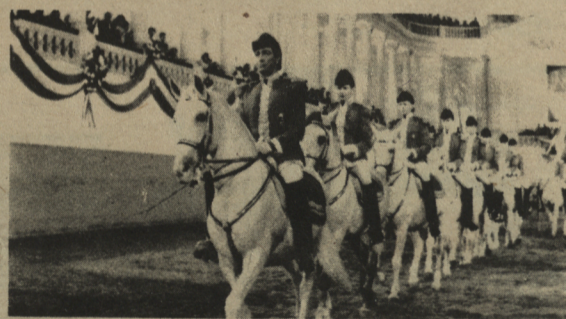
