Speaking of wallets undeniably leads to the memory of registration day. Even with pre-registration, there were still the same old mix-ups. This year's award for "The Fa-

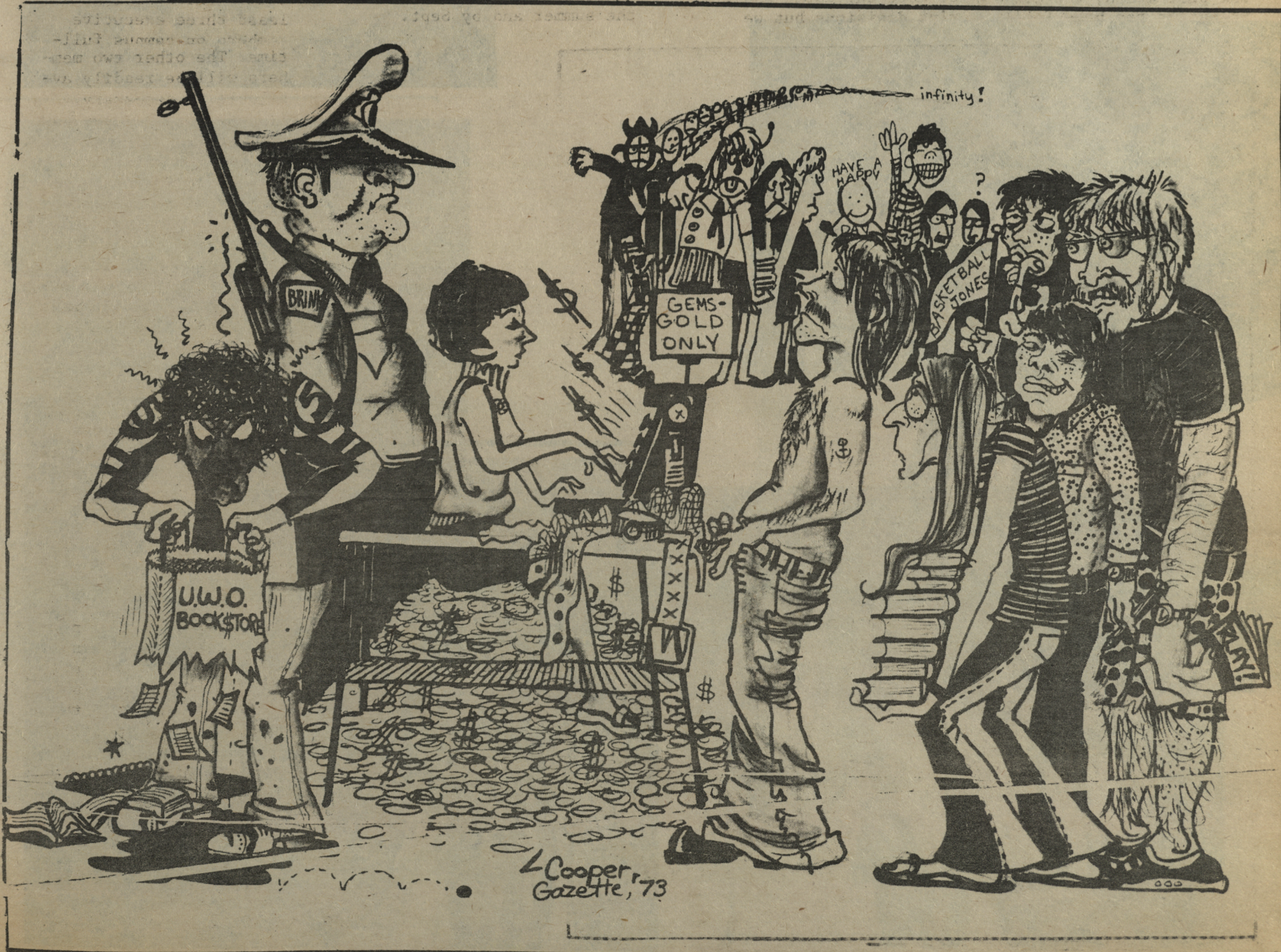
