Success Tip— Bake it with MAGIC! DATE-ORANGE PUDDING
Combine in a greased casserole (6-cup size) 1/2 c. orange syrup, 1 tbs. grated lemon rind and 1/2 c. orange juice. Mix and sift once, then sift into a bowl, 1 1/2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/2 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 2 1/2 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt and 1/4 c. fine granulated sugar. Mix in 1/2 c. corn flakes, slightly crushed, and 1/2 c. cut-up pitted dates. Combine 1 well-beaten egg, 1/2 c. milk, 1/2 tsp. vanilla and 3 tbs. shortening, melted. Make a light in dry ingredients and add liquids; mix well. Turn into prepared dish. Bake in moderately hot oven, 375°, about 40 minutes. Serve warm, with pouring cream. Yield—6 servings.

A Feature for Every Friday Among The Farmers Federation Of Agriculture News
And The Rain Came Down
The early bird is supposed to catch the worm but the early hay-maker is catching the rain. Under the heavy mat of clover many fields are soaked and there is evidence of rotting and mold in the bottom portion of the crop. The excess moisture will make curing of hay on the ground quite difficult. This could be a year when trench silos would demonstrate their value.
Semi-Annual Meeting At Murray River
The semi-annual meeting held a week ago at Murray River was well conducted, well attended and produced lively discussion. The resolution suggesting a measure of control in the cutting of pulpwood was hotly debated and finally held over for further consideration.
The resolution calling for the use of new sacks only, for potatoes showed that potato growers felt long time protection of the industry from disease would be more important than immediate gain from the use of second hand sacks.
Other resolutions suggested the desirability of more rapid expansion of electrical facilities, extension of ferry service later in the fall and the need for overhauling the Election Act.
The recommendation that a joint committee from the government, the Federation and interested dealers should be set up to study the Newfoundland trade showed that farmers are aware of the value of this trade and not altogether satisfied with its present state.
