His failure to retid a remarkable, especially when South showed something in diamonds by doubling East's cue bid. Six diamonds would have been a far better slam than six spades. West, having played with that particular partner before, did not seriously; he reasoned that if East had really been void, he would have doubled six spades to demand a diamond lead. So West tried a surprise attack of the heart queen. South won with the ace, led a low trump to the ace, then took the trump finesse to his own jack. Whether he should have taken this finesse is a moot point in view of the marked psychic bidding by East, but the pertinent fact is that when West won the trick, he had a problem. Should he now lead a diamond in the hope of East's ruffing, or should he try for a club trick? After profound thought, West decided that South, if he had held three diamonds and no clubs, would have refused the trump finesse in an effort to avoid a possible diamond ruff. So West led the club king, and that was the end of the slam contract.
